

Welcome to the "dog days" of summer! I'm guessing you've all heard that expression (and probably used it). I always just assumed it was an old-timer's way to refer to the hottest part of the summer, when we tend to just lie around panting in the heat (like, you know, the way a dog does). I recently learned there's more to it than that. This time of the year, from July 3, through August 11, is when the star Sirius (aka the Dog Star) appears in the sky just before the sun, marking the hottest days of the year (at least, in the Northern Hemisphere). The ancient Romans referred to this period as *dies caniculares*, or "days of the dog star" which was eventually translated as just "dog days." Ancient literature from all over the Biblical world is full of descriptions of the willpower-draining and strength-sapping effects of this time.

And while I get more gumption as the weather cools off, I appreciate this time when things slow down (August is the only month with no Federal holidays or cultural celebrations), and the only major thing to think about is going back to school.
