


Newsletter





The first recorded use of the English word "hardheaded" was in Foxe's Book of Martyrs, which was first published in 1563. In Book 8 of the Actes and Monuments (AKA, Foxe's Book of Martyrs), the author is describing various heretical or sectarian groups that had arisen in earlier centuries in England and Europe. He often lumps them together as being obstinate or unwilling to submit to the authority of the Church. The word's first usage in context is (with modernized spelling for clarity): "There sprang up in the days of King Henry certain new sects, a hardheaded and stubborn sort of people, who refused the ordinances of the Church and would not be ordered by reason or authority."


Foxe is talking about groups that were active during the reign of King Henry the 8th (after his break with Rome and the Catholic Church) that Foxe considered difficult, rebellious, and obstinate in their views. So, the earliest use of the word "hardheaded" is about a person who is simply stubborn to the point of folly, and not in the sense of being persistent, tenacious, or unyielding. Interestingly, Foxe is lumping together those who rejected infant baptism as having any saving value; but also those who deny the Trinity. While we would certainly be included in the former group, we must most forcefully reject the later group.

Foxe is using the word negatively, which is interesting because in his *Book of Martyrs*, in the letter from Dr. Brooks, Bishop of Gloucester to Dr. Thomas Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury, he speaks very highly of the prophet Ezekiel. Now, if you want to talk about someone who is hardheaded (in the more positive sense persistent, tenacious, unvielding), then Ezekiel should be at the top of your list. He had a specific call from God to be hardheaded in a world that seemed like it was falling apart. Sound familiar? We must learn this vital skill from the Old Testament prophet. This fall, we're going to be working our way through the book of Ezekiel, specifically focused on what it can teach us about faithfulness to God and what I call "holy stubbornness" and tenacity in a world that's often apathetic (or even openly hostile) to the Lord.

Along the way, we're going to build house walls for a deserving family in our parking lot with the Fuller Center for Housing on Saturday, September 6, and there will be a four-week Wired Class (our primary mechanism for those who are interested in joining Chapel Rock as members and/or getting plugged in and serving here) starting on Sunday, September 14. My hope for this fall is that we can redeem the term "hardheaded" and make it a positive: we will be as unyielding in our commitment to the Lord and His Word and His mission in the world as Ezekiel was.
