

## Prayer Service, Sunday, January 10, 6pm

Praying Isaiah 61:1-3 Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit (*Luke 4:14-19*). He stood up to read in the synagogue, and the scroll of Isaiah was handed to Him. Unrolling it, He found where it is written:

**Let us pray what Jesus read: The Spirit of the Lord is on Me and has anointed me to:**

- Preach good news to the poor, the afflicted
- Bind up and heal the brokenhearted
- Proclaim freedom for captives (Physical & Spiritual)
- Release from darkness/recovery of sight for the blind
- Release the oppressed from oppression
- Proclaim the year of the Lord's favor
- Grant consolation, joy, comfort to all who mourn
- Give a garment of praise for the spirit of despair
- Display his glory

1. Who do you want me to pray for? Who specifically needs to hear the **good news** of salvation?
2. Lord, what **broken** relationship or **broken** people do you want me to pray for?
3. Lord, what **captives** do you want me to pray that you would set free?
4. Lord, show me my own **blind spots** and **deceptions**, and let me pray for those in others.
5. Lord, who is **oppressed** that you would have me pray for?
6. Lord, who do you want to **bless** with your favor in a special way?
7. Lord, who do you want to **comfort**?
8. Lord, who do you want me to pray for that is **discouraged**?
9. Lord, show us your **glory**! Glorify yourself!

Start by praying for yourself, and family. Next, pray for our church, especially our Overseers and ministry leaders. Next, pray for our community, especially your next-door neighbors and co-workers. Next, pray for our state. Next, pray for our nation. Finally, pray for our world, especially our missionaries around the world.
