wind, that wind which is the Holy Spirit of God. I have a petition that all of the subtle systemic aspects of racism will be both honestly recognized and courageously overcome. I have a petition that we will seek what Martin Luther King, Jr. once called a "double victory" of freedom for oppressed and oppressor alike and that each and every protest will always be ultimately rooted in that divine love for all humanity which casts out human fear. And I have a petition that we will all recognize the truth the Franciscan monk Richard Rohr expressed when he wrote, "If we do not transform our pain, we will most assuredly transmit it." At the same time, I do not want to neglect the second angel's basket, as we are all often tempted to do. I want to give thanks for a God Who steadfastly refuses to give up on any of us-a God Who is forever and always at work for good: forming, reforming, and transforming the world, the church, and every human heart. I want to give thanks for the privilege of being called—along with all my sisters and brothers-to be not passive spectators but active participants amidst the ongoing struggle for peace with justice in our personal relationships, our neighborhoods, and our world. I want to give thanks for the strength God graciously promises to us amidst that struggle. And I want to give thanks for a place called Aldersgate which offers the world a glimpse of people who keep humbly seeking to learn to live together in love.

Yes, I have my petitions, but I also have my prayers of thanksgiving ... and not just on the fourth Thursday in November.

May the Lord bless you and keep you this Thanksgiving!

housing in less than 60 days. Over 90% remain housed one year post-transition. Aldersgate is just one congregation in the Interfaith Hospitality Network that makes this program possible by providing overnight accommodations and meals for 1 week, 4 times a year.

Did you know that we have over 1,000 members at Aldersgate? What a blessing it is to have the word of GOD brought to so many people. I am sorry to say that so far this calendar year only 321donors have made contributions to our church. An interesting fact is that the Average Monthly Giving per Donor is \$199.17. Would you consider yourself average or exceptional? Just think what could be done if more members were led to share their gifts.

As of the end of September, we are operating with a net loss of over \$43,000 since July when our fiscal year began. Our income is about 2% below last year at this time. On the other hand, our expenses are 11% lower than last year. While the major portion of our expenses is linear, contributions fluctuate significantly.

## Tax Planning around Contributions under the New Tax Law

The Tax Jobs and Cuts Act of 2017 greatly increased the amount of the standard deduction for 2018 meaning that many less taxpayers will be itemizing their deductions, which means that many will no longer gain a tax benefit from charitable contributions.

Filing Status	Standard Deduction Amount
Single	\$12,000
Married Filing Jointly & Surviving Spouse	\$24,000
Married Filing Separately	\$12,000
Head of Household	\$18,000

For taxpayers age 65 or older the standard deduction increases to \$13,600 for single and \$26,600 for married filing jointly.

However, there are still strategies for getting a tax benefit from your contributions -

- If you are over 70 ½ and required to take a minimum distribution from an IRA account, you can direct the trustee of your IRA to transfer your distribution to the church to fund your contribution. While you will not receive a charitable deduction, the distribution from your IRA is non-taxable.
- Another strategy is bunching your deductions into one tax year. You might consider pre-paying your pledge for 2019 prior to December 31, 2018. You would then have double the deductions for 2018 which might enable you to take advantage of itemizing in 2018. You would have no or little contributions in 2019, then employ the same strategy in 2020. This strategy is available to all taxpayers regardless of age.
