REMEMBER

- Paul and Timothy planted a church in the Roman colony of Philippi (you can read about it in Acts 16). They found a group of spiritual seekers praying outside of the city who became the first European converts and Gentile church.
- Paul has at least 2 big problems: 1) he's stuck in prison when he wants to be moving on mission and 2) other Christians are gossiping as they're gospeling, discrediting Paul and building their own platform while he's sidelined.
- As Paul is dealing with these problems, we see how pressure does at least 2 things, it:
 1) reveals character and 2) invites perspective.
- Surely the only way that Paul was able to keep his cool was because **the gospel** was big enough to break him of any self-preoccupation. **The gospel is the banner** under which all of our problems, politics, priorities, perspectives, and pride gets surrendered.

• Read Philippians 1.12-18a

REFLECT

- **1.** What **word or phrase** from this passage grabs your attention the most and why? What's most **surprising**?
- 2. Paul's plans didn't go as he expected. Paul had outsiders misunderstanding him and spreading different narratives. What connections can you make to your life and our world today? In other words, how have you seen or experienced these kind of problems?
- 3. How have pressure and problems affected your view, experience, or ideas of God and faith? Has your thinking or dealing with them changed over time? What prompted that change?
- **4.** What does it look like to let the gospel be "the banner under which all things are surrendered"? In other words, **what does Christian living actually look** like when the gospel is central? **How** do we do that in our lives and churches/communities?
- **5.** Paul essentially lands on this perspective: "I can still preach the gospel in this place I didn't expect to be and even though those preachers have mixed motives, at least more people are hearing the gospel." What's something in your life you're trying to see from a gospel perspective?
- **6.** What can we pause and pray for in our lives and community right now?
