REMEMBER

- We're in the season of **Advent**—the season of waiting and the church's New Year.
- We put ourselves back in time looking ahead to Christ's *first* advent as we also look forward to when Christ will come again.
- A **prophet** sees the world through God's eyes—they see the reality of how things really are. Prophets see the world as it *ought* to be and and *will* be.
- What did Isaiah see? He sees a **sprout** that's anointed with a **spirit** who is a **judge** setting things right and a **banner** calling people home.

REFLECT on the season

 Where are you in your life with God and others this week of Advent? (Do you feel distracted or focused? At peace or on edge? Hopeful or worried? Inspired or discouraged?...)

READ Isaiah 11.1-10

REFLECT on the passage

- 2. What word, phrase, or idea is most interesting or surprising to you from this passage? Why?
- 3. What does this passage reveal about **God's desire, will, and/or work** in the world?
- 4. How does this passage **inspire hope** in God's people (even though this king won't arrive for several centuries)?
- 5. What **glimmers of hope** do you see in your life and world this week? In other words, what's giving you hope that things will be better?
- 6. Are there any **invitations** you've been sensing in your life with God?

 Calls to trust, pray, or partner **more intentionally** with God or neighbor?
- 7. What can we **pause and pray** for in our lives, neighborhood, and world right now?
