

PORTION IN A NUTSHELL

BECHUKOTAI (IN MY STATUTES)

Elohim promised to give rain when needed to the land if the people walk in His ways and obey His commands. He also promised that the land would grow its crops, the trees would bear fruit, grapes would be plentiful, bread would be in everyone's house, no dangerous animals would hurt them, there would be peace in the land, and their enemies would run away and be defeated. The people were promised to have children. Their food would not spoil quickly. If Israel disobeys G-d's commands, they will be overtaken and not be blessed in any way. Their land will not be blessed. Their homes will not be blessed. Adonai will discipline disobedient people. If the people turn from their wicked ways, Elohim will remember His covenant with Jacob and Isaac and Abraham. G-d will not utterly destroy them or break His covenant with them even when they are in the land of their enemies. Adonai is our Elohim. G-d spoke to Moshe. He told him to tell the people the rules about making vows. These rules kept things fair between people. Adonai also told them that every tithe of the land (seed or fruit) is Elohim's and it is holy. G-d gave rules for redeeming a tithe. These things were commanded to Moses for Israel on Mount Sinai.



There was a young man who was raised in the Messianic Jewish faith, but had started doing his own thing and living a way that was not pleasing to Elohim. One day *out of the blue* he and his girlfriend decided to attend a random fellowship. A prophet happened to be there and he called the young couple out and asked them to stand up. The prophet didn't know them, but just like Y'shua and the woman at the well, the prophet began telling them things about themselves (John 4:7-26). **The prophet told the young lady, "You believe in your heart, but have never confessed with your mouth. If you don't confess Y'shua before men, Y'shua will not confess you before the Father. Would you like to confess Y'shua right now?"** She began to weep and the prophet led her in a prayer before the congregation that changed her entire life. Then the prophet turned to the young man and said, "You know the way, but you stopped following G-d 5 years ago and you should be in jail right now, but because of the mercy of Adonai you are not." The young man also began to weep as he knew that what was being said was true in his life and that he was in desperate need of change. **The prophet went on to urge the young man to stop walking contrary to Elohim as this was his warning.** In Vayikra 25:23-24, G-d spoke to his children saying that if they walk contrary to him, that he will walk contrary to them and will punish them seven times for their sins. That young man was being punished repeatedly, but could not see how his lifestyle of walking contrary to G-d was the reason for his woes. For the good in his life, he felt unsatisfied. Verse 26 says that "ye shall eat, and not be satisfied." You may have some unsettled things in your life that are causing you to feel unsatisfied and might be hindering you from a fulfilling relationship with the Father. So what are you waiting for? Follow Him!
