

Easter is a time when our WHOLE church needs to step up and use this opportunity to make a difference in Jesus' name.


How can we make a difference this Easter? Here are two ways:

On Sunday, April 15, at 9:30 am in the Sanctuary, the University United Methodist Church will feature the Chancel Choir in a presentation of Gospel Mass by Robert Ray.

Dr. Ray composed the work in 1978 while a liturgy team leader for the National Office of Black Catholics. It is his interpretation of the Ordinary (Kyrie, Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei) of the Catholic Mass utilizing the joyous styles, rhythms and harmonies of contemporary African-American music.

A seminal work of African-American music, it is performed by choirs and churches all over the world. According to the composer, God played a role in the writing of the work. "God controls everything I do. It was written in about a two-week peri-

od. The hard part for me was not being a formally trained composer. The creativity was a result of divine inspiration. He was working with me."

It has been many years since the Chancel Choir has presented a complete rendition of **Gospel Mass**. This is a rare and unique opportunity to hear a work full of life, energy, and excitement. As Dr. Ray stated, "I wanted everyone to experience the sense of joy and celebration that is generally felt in true African-American worship."







DisAbility Ministries Update from Sharon McCart

This is my sixth year in DisAbility Ministries and my work continues to grow and change. I am still working at both the denominational (global) level and also within our annual conference.

Denominational level work:

Serving as chair of the DisAbility Ministries Committee of The United Methodist Church keeps me busy. We will no longer be part of the General Board of Global Ministries after May 31, 2018. This means we will lose our funding so there is now a plan in progress to fundraise and also to remain an official part of the United Methodist Church. I remain hopeful that the end of 2018 will find us in a better position than ever! Some of my activities include writing blog articles, posting to our Facebook page, and I have given interviews to United Methodist Communications for articles. I have also recently been invited to oversee quarterly submissions to the General Board of Church and Society's e-newsletter, "Faith in Action."

Conference level work:

In my role as chair of the Cal-Pac DisAbility Ministries Task Force, I preach, teach, consult and whatever else is needed. I work every year at Annual Conference and recently I have been teaching a workshop at trainings in three of our five districts. We were able to award four grants in 2017 and five grants in 2016. We hope to be able to offer grants this year as well.

Philippines Solidarity Mission Trip:

Most of you know that I went to the Philippines last summer, learning about the justice work being done there. I will be returning this summer, revisiting the prison, the school, and the hospital that was under construction and is now open. Our Health Ministries Team has already expressed support for this new hospital, built expressly for the indigenous people who have had little access to healthcare. We will also learn more from the justice workers we met last summer. Because of last summer's visit, the United Methodist Women's Board is planning a three-day disability conference that will take place at the end of this year's trip. I am excited to learn from them and be able to speak to them!

Deaconess Consecration:

On May 18, I will be consecrated as a deaconess at United Methodist Women Assembly in Columbus, Ohio. The office of deaconess is recognition of a lifetime call to lay ministry in the United Methodist Church. The deaconesses I know serve marginalized people, who are typically underserved in society. The order of Deaconesses and Home Missioners is a loving, supportive community and I am excited and grateful to join it.

It bears repeating that I thank all of you for your love and support. I wouldn't be who I am today without all of you.



Being new to the world of missions 20 years ago I thought that a "real" mission trip meant that one had to serve outside the United States. Boy, was I wrong. God did not qualify "Love your neighbor" by including borders or boundaries. However, our first two mission trips to Costa Rica actually did fall into my preconceived notion that mission trips were conducted outside the US. Then Hurricane Katrina hit the Gulf Coast in 2005 and it became very clear that helping our neighbors in the South was our primary goal for the next few years. I learned along with my team members that a mission trip is really a "mission journey" of caring, serving, loving, and learning. We learned to care more deeply about each other as we cared for those in need of shelter. We learned the essence of serving others by placing their needs over ours. We learned about the Love of Christ by being the hands and feet of Christ. We learned by doing and listening. Each one of our team members will have a story to tell about an experience that happened to them that they will never forget. Lasting memories of what they have done help to shape who we are as a church faith community.


