Borders remain closed - Virtual Ministry Continues

Borders remain closed in the countries in which we actively minister (Colombia, Brazil, Peru, Costa Rica, and Panama.) Therefore, technology is a blessing. It enables us to have contact with the pastors and leaders as well as minister to those who have internet access.

Russ completed **27 virtual lessons on Revelation** and is presently doing a series study in **I Corinthians**. The village people are sharing these lessons among themselves.

The premise of II Timothy 2:2 is being fulfilled among the indigenous people... "And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also."

These indigenous leaders have studied in seminars **that you have sponsored with your financial gifts**. Now they are traveling by riverboat to six remote villages among the Tikuna, Cocama, and Yagua tribes to encourage young men and women to attend the next session of the Bible Institute. **The studies continue!** Those students will learn how to evangelize, disciple new believers, and start churches in the villages that have no

gospel witness. **Please pray for this outreach to the unreached.**

Ministry with the Guahibos

During the Covid-19 crisis, the Guahibo people have stayed close to their villages to prevent transmission of the infection. This remote area has very little cell phone reception or internet accessibility. However, we have received word that some have contracted the illness and died. There are few medical facilities in their area. **Please pray for these people.**

Covid-19 in Costa Rica

Costa Rica is experiencing a surge in Covid-19 infections. They have recorded 45,680 cases as of September 4. Due to infection in the police force, some regions were without a police presence. In high risk areas, restrictions remain in place while the government partially opens the tourism industry. At this time they are allowing flights into Costa Rica from a limited number of countries - mostly European - and from only a few states of the USA.
