SMBTS's finances remain in a strong position. Combined offerings and contributions received through August 31 total \$185,000 and exceed the budget expectations by more than \$6,000. Overall expenses remain consistent with the FY2025 budget. Interest income on cash holdings continue to help reduce the negative operating results that were budgeted for the entire year (expenses budgeted to exceed offerings/inflows by \$23,000). Total cash reserves are approximately \$697,000 as of August 31. These reserves are projected to decrease to support the annual operating budget as well as forecasted capital outlays for building maintenance and structural improvement projects.
