FROM THE LEAD PASTOR

On the first Sunday of this month we begin Holy Week, the most sacred period of our Christian faith. It is a time when we gather together as a community of faith to journey with Jesus to Jerusalem (Palm Sunday), to gather at the Table with his friends for one last meal (Maundy Thursday), to stand with him before his accusers, to walk to Golgotha, and to stand at the foot of his cross (Good Friday). Finally, on Easter Sunday, we will joyously celebrate the resurrection of Christ, lifting our voices in praise of the hope that is ours and the world's.

I invite you to join us for all of it (either in-person or online), if you can, remembering that without the journey of Holy Week, Easter loses its deep meaning. We will remember both Maundy Thursday and Good Friday with Covenant United Methodist Church and our District Superintendant, Rev. Daniel Miranda, will preach for us on Maundy Thursday. Our special Holy Week services and Easter Activities are designed to help us walk with Christ and experience the joy of Easter!

One of the occupational hazards of being a preacher is that we are constantly on the look-out for sermon ideas. I'm sure my daughters cringe when I start a story that involves them. If they don't yet I'm sure they will by the time they're teenagers. While she's never said anything, I'm sure my wife dreads the drive home from a movie because it is almost inevitable that I will find something in the movie that I think might "preach."

There are so many illustrations of our faith out in the world and in popular culture. And those of us who prepare sermons week after week after week, we have learned to look anywhere and everywhere for ideas about how to talk about our faith.

In that spirit, later this month I will begin a new series of sermons based on some quotes from the fictional TV character and series, "Ted Lasso." Ted Lasso is the story of a semi-successful, mid-level college football coach in the USA who is surprisingly hired as the new manager (coach) of the Richmond Football (soccer) Club in England. It's a classic "fish out of water" trope that is compelling because of Coach Lasso's intentional and genuine optimism.

This TV show tells a great story and has compelling characters and there is much to like about it. At the same time, it is not "Christian programming," as it contains adult language and adult situations that are not appropriate for all audiences. So just a warning. It is entirely up to you whether or not you watch the show. You will not need to watch the show in order to understand the sermons. I'm planning to share a few of Ted Lasso's best one-liners and a few clips from the shop paired with scriptures to help us explore essential truths for living lives of faith and love.

I'm calling the series "Gospel Lessons with Ted Lasso." I hope you'll consider joining us on Sundays at 9am & 10:30am beginning April 16.

Pastor's Pen: "Can It Be That Simple?"

Dear Ones,

I had a moment (well, actually, several hours) one night during my recent "down time" that brought me around once again to that most basic of all questions: "What is this life really all about anyway?"

Not long after my surgery I had one of those nights when I just couldn't sleep, not a wink. As I lay there hour after hour trying to count sheep, what came popping up instead of sheep were all of my past mistakes, failures, and missed opportunities, coupled with a deep dread that I wasn't going to have enough time left to get it all done...and my "it" list is still pretty long.

Later I would recognize that the darkness I felt that night was no doubt fueled by a recent birthday, pain, and some fairly heavy-duty medication...but what I felt that night was pretty dark, and it took me a couple of days to fully shake those feelings – feelings of failure, disappointment, and of a too-short future. ("Seventy-seven" just sounded different than any other past birthday!)

So, for two or three days, the questions lingered – "Has my life mattered? Should I have done more? How can I make these last years count?" et cetera, et cetera, et cetera... You would think that I've walked in the light of God's grace long enough to know better than to fall into such a dark, deep hole...but "fall" I did!

So, how did I crawl out? My best attempts at self-talk didn't get the job done...prayer wasn't working real well... Carol's loving kick in the britches didn't break me out of my "the sky has fallen" funk...

Two things broke me loose. The first was re-remembering the most central of Jesus' commands: "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself." – Luke 10:27

I've lost track of how many times I've preached that passage in my 48 years of pastoring. The question is, "can it really be that simple?!" With all the complexities of faith, belief systems, Theological ponderings...is it truly as simple as loving God, others, and self with our whole being? The answer, I found again, is "yes."

And as my soul reopened, I did another thing – I re-read the cards and notes I'd received since being down from folks (including some of you who are reading this) who have been friends and members of churches I've pastored. A word would break through here and there that gave a more concrete answer to the question "what is it all about, anyway?" A note from a young Syrian woman whose family I've known and loved for the last 6 years (since they came to Spokane as refugees) meant so much to me. The note reminded me again of what actually happens when we expand our view of "loving our neighbor as ourselves". The note returned that love which was given.

Again, I know that my temporary darkness was being aided by pain and medication...but it wasn't a wasted exercise at this stage of my faith walk to have to stumble around in the darkness for a couple of days, and re-remember the most central premise of Jesus' teaching — that 3-pronged command to love. After all, isn't that the Easter Promise?

There are things in my life that I can't do over, but this is one thing I can continue doing – I can continue to grow in love.
