


On Sunday, August 17th we will celebrate and witness the confirmation of Julian Soto and Xavier Duarte. Julian and Xavier will affirm their faith in Jesus Christ and commit to membership in the church. This summer we focused on one question: What does it mean to you to have God in your life? We had some good lessons and conversations and we took a couple field trips.

We visited Elmhurst University and learned of the school's United Church of Christ history and commitment to scholarship, service, and social justice. We learned about one famous alum Reinhold Niebuhr, author of the Serenity Prayer. We also spent time in Hammerschmidt Chapel where Rev. Martin Lither King Jr. spoke in 1966. We talked about how our faith is more than Sunday morning; how we practice our faith everyday - in learning, in hobbies, in our work, in our community. We also took a field trip to places of worship and looked for similarities and differences between our worship space and practices at St. Paul's and our neighbors. With chaperone Barb Kamp, we visited BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir in Bartlett (a Hindu place of worship) and Holy Name Cathedral in downtown Chicago. We recognized how architecture and space are used to give praise and honor to the divine and appreciated how our own space is cared for and still looks new after almost 13 years. We also noticed similar religious messages of welcome, peace, and serving our neighbors. We were invited to attend a midday Hindu prayer service and were honored to be passed the candle of blessing. The Holy Name tour allowed us to get close to the impressive altar and beautiful running water baptismal font which moved all of us.

On Confirmation Sunday, Julian and Xavier will share what it means to have God in their life. We will celebrate the gift of faith with them and offer our friendship and encouragement as they take these next steps on their Christian faith walk into young

adulthood.

Meet Gay Bouwmeester St. Paul's Organist



Greetings St. Paul's Church,

On the first Sunday in August, I will be celebrating my fifteenth anniversary here at St. Paul's. It seems as if fifteen years would feel like a long time, but for me, those years spent working and worshipping with you all have gone by in a flash. This congregation has come to mean very much to me. You are my friends, my brothers and sisters in Christ, and I value all the time that I have spent with you.

Things have been changing in my life recently. Many of you know that several years ago I started a program with Linda Schambach to become Licensed Ministers in the UCC. Many of you also know that this didn't work out the way we had planned. Linda is continuing her ministry efforts with the Disciples of Christ. I have been called back to the Church of the Brethren. Right now, I am working through the Training in Ministry (TRIM) program through Bethany Seminary in Richmond, IN. On July 20, my Brethren congregation voted to license me as a minister of that church. My actual licensing will take place on September 21. I will continue to take classes with Bethany and hopefully will be ordained later next year.

This is a calling I have felt all of my life, and it seems that it might finally be fulfilled. What does that mean for me here at St. Paul's? Well, nothing immediately, but my name and ministerial profile will be sent out to churches in the district. If one of them is interested in me as pastor, well, then it's time for me to discern if leaving St. Paul's and joining another church as their minister is the right choice. I could most certainly use your prayers over the next months as I seek to find God's will and way for my life.

In the meantime, I will be here most Sundays, enjoying worship with you all. My prayer for you now and in the future comes from the words of St. Paul, the first Christian theologian and the man whose name we claim. "I thank my God every time I mention you in my prayers... I'm sure about this: the one who started a good work in you will stay with you to complete the job by the day of Jesus Christ. I have good reason to think this way about all of you because I keep you in my heart." (taken from Philippians 1: 3-7)

Blessings of the Animals Art Contest


Submit your artwork inspired by the hymn lyric: All things bright and beautiful, All creatures great and small



Book Talk: Unclobber by Colby Martin

Wednesdays August 6, 13, 20 from 6:30 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. at the Ministry House

This August we will take on the heavy topic of how the Biblical interpretation has been misused to "clobber" LGBTQ+ people. We'll do this with the Progressive Christian lens of *UnClobber: Rethinking Our Misuse of the Bible on Homosexuality*, written by Colby Martin (https://a.co/d/hQjMiij). Through this lens, we will reexamine six frequently quoted passages of Scripture.



This three-session series is designed to open our dialogue on where God is calling us to respond to present needs and active support of the LGBTQ+ community locally and beyond.

Highlights from the work and witness of the 35th General Synod (July 11-15)

In partnership with the UCC Media Justice Ministry, the Missouri Mid-South Conference proudly announced the launch of KPVF-FM, a progressive faith radio station based in the St. Louis area and streaming nationwide. The station's antenna will be installed in the steeple of St. Paul's UCC in Oakville, Missouri, broadcasting on 99.7 FM.

The UCC National Collaborative on Immigration gathered over 200 people outside the Conference Center to call on the Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agency (ICE) to stop the raids, family separation, and disappearances of community members that have been escalating under the current administration. The 35th General Synod overwhelmingly approved an emergency resolution that opposes this administration's immigration policies, supports immigrants and refugees, and calls for antiracism work.

Rev. Traycee Potter the UCC's youth and young adult engagement minister and director for Love of Children, addressed the age-old lament heard churchwide, "Pastor, we need more children and youth" by saying it was time to rewrite that narrative. It's time to stop focusing on bringing [youth] into the church to save a church. It's about recognizing children as a vital part of the worshipping community, and taking seriously intergenerational ministry.

The 35th General Synod declared the church to be in 'full communion' with its longtime Caribbean partner, Iglesia Evangélica Unida de Puerto Rico. The Iglesia left the UCC after

the Synod voted in 2005 to support marriage equality for LGBTQ people.

The Rev. Shari Prestemon was elected the Associate General Minister, Co-Executive of Global Ministries. Before joining the National Ministries, Prestemon served 10 years as the Conference Minister for the Minnesota Conference, and also served as executive director at Back Bay Mission, and as a local church pastor. With a deep well of experience, a heart rooted in justice, and a vision attuned to the needs of the wider Church.
