from the PASTOR


Breathe. That was my star word for 2025. Star words are an exercise in prayerful contemplation: letting the word hop on your train of thought with unlimited rides. As we prepare to receive a new word, I invite you to reflect on your 2025 word (if you remember it). How did it teach you? Inspire you? What did it reveal to you about faith and God? Or why did it NOT inspire you? If you'd like please share your 2025 star word experience with me at pastorliz24@gmail.com.

When I pulled the word BREATHE last year, a core memory was unlocked. When I was 14 I went with my boyfriend to the Bally's gym. I had never been to a gym and never worked out with weights. (I lied about my age to get in.) As I was given a tour of the equipment, I tried each machine. I felt strong and capable. Leg press, lat pull. I was nailing it. Then all of a sudden, I felt the room go dark. I woke up on the floor surrounded by paramedics. I had passed out. The heavy lifting wasn't the problem. I had forgotten to breathe. All these years later, I still remember to breathe when heavy lifting, but I also understand the wisdom of breathing to regulate my spirit as much as my oxygen. My memory and my word joined forces to remind me of Paul's wisdom in Philippians, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (4:13). This is the wisdom that came to mind every time I saw my word.

This year I kept the word card in my wallet. I didn't plan it this way, but every time I searched for my insurance cards, I saw the reminder: BREATHE. A deep breath in the midst of anxiousness is a good idea in general, but breathing as prayer, breathing to receive God's presence and guidance, that reminder was a gift to me. Breathe and know that I am God.

What memories will this year's star word unlock for you? How will the Spirit work through your word to teach you, guide you, inspire you, heal you? Whatever your word in 2026 or your relationship with it, I hope you will give it a chance. Tape it to a mirror. Keep it by your computer. Post it on the fridge. Like the Bethlehem star guided the way to Jesus, let your star word be a creative prayer practice; let it hop on your train of thought and move you closer to Jesus.



MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT Creation Care



In November, the council voted to create our newest ministry at St. Paul's: the Creation Care Ministry. The seeds were planted in April when David Schoenknecht visited St. Paul's. David is a Naturalist at Hawthorne Hill Nature Center in Elgin. David invited St. Paul's (and all Elgin churches) to participate in the Churches of Restoration Chicagoland cohort. I put an invitation out to the congregation and among those interested, Eric Hayley and Ron Zemke enthusiastically stepped forward to participate. The cohort is sponsored by A Rocha USA and equips churches to implement projects that live out God's call to care for creation and equip others to do likewise, right where we're planted. "You cannot care for what you do not love and you will not love what you do not know." Our goal with this ministry is to recultivate our connection with God's creation around us with hands on learning, study, prayer, and restorative projects.

Ron, Eric, and I attended the inaugural workshops in September and October, gathering with other churches from Evanston to Champaign. Our 2026-27 project goals for St. Paul's include helping the congregation connect with our core mission value "Love of Creation" with outdoor experiences, a book study, and native plant restoration on our church property. Council approved \$1000.00 for the Creation Care ministry in the 2026 budget and we will also apply for an \$800 matching grant. Eric Hayley will join the council in 2026 as the Creation Care representative.


