Human Sexuality: A Way Forward in The United Methodist Church

**moving toward

Recently, we hosted Bishop Laurie Haller and the East Central District. 215 people came to hear about the official proposal going before the specially-called General Conference in February 2019 about our way forward as United Methodists.

Currently, The United Methodist Church declares that all are welcome and all individuals are of sacred worth but the practice of homosexuality (so not homosexual people themselves) is incompatible with Christian scripture and tradition. Further, the church prevents clergy from officiating at same-sex unions, teaches that marriage is between a man and a woman, and prohibits the ordination of self-professed practicing homosexuals. Not everyone agrees with this position and want it changed. Therefore, some have broken our covenant as an act of defiance or justice by marrying same-sex persons. Further, some annual conferences have ordained LGBT persons.

This debate around human sexuality has been waged, really, since the first General Conference in 1972 after the merger between the Methodist and Evangelical United Brethren denominations in 1968. It came to a head in 2016 and the Bishops, rightly or wrongly, took matters into their own hands and formed this Commission and called for this special General Conference to determine how we will move forward. We now have an official answer. While the Commission gave three plans to the Bishops, they are recommending one of them in February.

The recommended **One Church Plan** neither affirms or condemns LGBT persons. It would remove language from our *Book of Discipline* restricting pastors and churches from conducting same-sex weddings and restricting annual conferences from ordaining self-avowed practicing homosexual persons. Therefore, pastors and churches, locally, would choose whether to perform or host same-sex weddings, and each annual conference would determine who to ordain.

This plan allows different practices in different places in America and around the world. It's based on the belief that we can

be a church with a large enough tent for people to disagree about homosexuality and yet remain together in unity and mission.

This "live and let live" plan, however, doesn't satisfy progressives, who say it doesn't bar discrimination against LGBT persons in some parts of the UMC. It doesn't satisfy traditionalists, who say it violates their interpretation of scripture.

For information, the Bishops are also sending to the General Conference the other two plans considered but not recommended. The **Traditionalist Model** would affirm the current language about homosexuality in the *Book of Discipline* and seek to strengthen enforcement for violations of church law. Congregations and clergy not able to abide by this would be provided a gracious exit, allowing them to keep such things as property and pensions. Interestingly, this is the only plan that allows for a gracious exit from the UMC if they don't agree with the General Conference decision in February.

The **Connectional Conference Model** would create a complex structure of three overlapping branches, one traditional, one progressive, and one centrist. Annual Conferences would choose to join one of them, but local churches and pastors who disagree with that choice, would be allowed to join a different branch.

This is where we stand for now. There will be changes. The Bishops asked the Judicial Council (our version of the Supreme Court) to review the One Church Plan ahead of time, and some are already arguing that it is not constitutional and will be rejected. Further, other unofficial plans have already been crafted. There will be an attempt to bring them before the General Conference, too. And whatever ends up before the delegates will likely be amended.

While it's impossible to know what this means for Salem yet, it is possible to have conversations and prayer together. We can continue welcoming and loving all people, trusting that God will lead us forward.

Report of the Leadership Board

Following the subcommittee meetings at 5:15 PM, the full board met at 5:40 PM. Chair Nancy Rawson led the meeting. She opened with prayer and shared a scripture reading from Luke 5:33-38 reminding us that even though we are new creations in Christ, the gospel, given to us a long time ago, is still relevant and true for our lives.

Treasurer's Report – *Linda Curson reported on the income and expenses for this year (January – August). Although we have had some generous giving months, we still have a deficit as our yearly expenses have been higher than our yearly income. We will continue to monitor the church's finances.

Leadership Board Development/Training – The LB continued discussing the book: *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory* by Tod Bolsinger. Leaders need to demonstrate that they are trustworthy, faithful to their calling, and that they have the skills to help people thrive. That trust is critical when facing changes and venturing into new territory.

A Way Forward District Gathering – Salem will host a fall gathering for our district on September 23. Bishop Laurie Haller will facilitate a discussion on the pros and cons of the three Commission on the Way Forward plans. Leadership Board members will be present to help host this event.

Fall Church Conference – The annual church conference will be held on October 29 at 7 PM here at Salem. Rev. Mike Morgan will be the presiding elder. In preparation for the conference, the LB completed the S/PPRC Appointment Advisory Consultation Form for the 2019 Appointment Year and discussed nominations to the Leadership Board for 2019. Troy Bergmann will serve as Leadership Board Chairperson for 2019.

Trustees – *Bids were received for cleaning the carpet in Fellowship Hall, the parlor, the mission closet, and adjacent hallways. The Trustees plan to schedule this cleaning during the month of November. *A fall work day is being planned for October 20. In order to complete more projects, the workday will go until 3:00 PM, with a small lunch provided. *A request to consider the creation of a concrete driveway on the west end of the parking lot will be tabled until next year. *The prairie grass/flowers project is continuing, with seeding to be done this fall.

Meeting Notes 9-18-18

*An upgrade to the AV system/booth in the sanctuary is being considered. *The Trustees are looking to improve the seals on some of our doors and to rehang the back door to prevent bugs entering the building. *Better signage in the elevator, particularly for the buttons indicating which floor is desired (1 and 2), is still consideration.

Stewardship – *Plans were discussed for the fall stewardship campaign. This will be the third year of the Generation to Generation building fund campaign but worshippers will also have the opportunity to make an annual giving pledge. Video testimonies from congregation members will be a part of the campaign presentation in November.

SPRC – *Reviews have been conducted on two new staff members as their 90 day probationary periods have been completed. One additional review is scheduled for September 25. *October is Pastor Appreciation Month. The congregation will be encouraged to express their gratitude to Pastor John and to our retired pastors, Rev. Dave Higdon and Rev. Joan Erbe. *The pastor's compensation and benefits for 2019, as well as staff compensation, will be discussed at next month's meeting.

Other Items – *The plant in the main entryway is overgrown and hiding the handicap door access button. Actions will be taken to correct this issue.

Closing – Nancy Rawson closed with prayer. The meeting adjourned at 7:45 PM.
