

Getting Ready to Go

for Sunday, July 6 - Luke 10:1-11, 16-20

This weekend, the Carruth family is packing up for Children's Camp—and I mean packing up everything. With six of us heading to Camp

Kulaqua, we're talking about bags on bags: swimsuits, towels, water bottles, sunscreen, bug spray, and of course, backup outfits for the backup outfits—because you never know what might happen on Messy Games Day.

But here's one thing I can say for sure: **no child will be hungry**. We'll eat three meals a day in the dining hall (and yes, the food is... well, okay!). But this is a full-on **Krissy Walker Production**, so trust me—there will be snacks upon snacks. Salty snacks. Sugary snacks. And if you're out on the field under the Florida sun, sweating it out during outdoor games? There will be **Supa Juice** to keep you going.

Still, beyond all the snacks and sunscreen, camp is really about helping kids stretch their courage and trust in God. Every child will be nudged out of their comfort zone. Whether it's climbing the Tower of Faith, leaping off the blob, or riding a horse for the first time, these moments—where nerves meet bravery—often become the place where God speaks something new.

That's what Jesus is doing in our Scripture passage today. In Luke 10, He sends out 72 disciples to go and prepare the way for Him. He gives them a clear mission—but not a clear roadmap. There's no firm timeline. No suitcase full of contingency plans. In fact, His packing list is shockingly short. Travel light, He says. Trust more.

Our sermon today is titled "**Sent and Surrendered**," and it lines up with one of our key membership questions: "Will you serve Him as Lord?" That question doesn't just mean showing up on Sundays. It means being willing to go—wherever Jesus leads, even when it's uncomfortable, even when it requires surrender.

At camp, we'll challenge our kids to trust God in new ways. And I hope that you will ask yourself today: Where is Jesus sending me? And am I willing to go with nothing but His Word and His presence?
