#### Be God's: The Freedom of Surrender



When we talk about giving, most of us instinctively Methodist Church tighten our grip. We start thinking about bills, plans, responsibilities, and the long list of things we feel we have to manage. But what if surrendering our money to

God wasn't about losing control—what if it was about gaining freedom?

That's what happens when we learn to trust God with every part of our lives—including our finances. When Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21), He wasn't trying to quilt anyone into giving. He was offering us a key to freedom. Because wherever your treasure goes, your heart follows—and when your treasure begins to move toward God, your heart moves closer too.

For most of us, money represents more than account balances. It's tied to things like security, control, and identity. We look to it for protection, for options, for a sense of worth. But when we begin to surrender it to God when we start saying, "Lord, all I have is Yours"—something powerful **happens inside us.** The anxiety that money creates begins to loosen its hold. The fear of not having enough starts to fade. We discover that generosity isn't a burden—it's a blessing.

This is why **Jesus talked about money so often**. Not because He wanted something from us, but because **He wanted something for us**: peace, joy, and a heart that is truly free. He knew that the surest way to break the power of greed, worry, and comparison is to give. Giving doesn't just bless others—it transforms the giver.

John Wesley said it this way: "When I have money, I get rid of it as quickly as possible, lest it find a way into my heart." He wasn't careless; he was careful—to make sure his trust staved where it belonged. He taught Christians to gain all they could, save all they could, and give all they could, because he knew that when money is used faithfully, it becomes one of God's best tools for love.

This Sunday, as we begin our two-week focus on stewardship at Perry Methodist Church, we're not just talking about budgets or bills. We're talking about discipleship. We're talking about the joy and freedom that come from letting go of what never truly belonged to us in the first place. When we surrender our finances to God, we find rest. We discover that He really does provide, that His promises are true, and that our lives are richer when our hearts are open.

So let's worship today with grateful hearts. Let's lift our voices and remember: God doesn't want part of us—He wants all of us. And when we give Him everything, including our treasure, what we receive in return is freedom.

Don't just be good. Be God's.
