- <u>Divided</u> devotion
 Luke 11
- <u>Distorted</u> priorities
- <u>Destructive</u> purposes *John 10:10*

Jesus victory over the enemy

Jesus <u>defeats</u> Satan by <u>destroying</u> and <u>disarming</u> the enemies power
 1 John 3:8; Colossians 2:13-15; 1 John 4:4

Jesus invites us to:

- <u>Recognize</u> who is behind what is happening Mark 8:27-38
- Resist the enemy's lies
- Receive real life through Jesus

Questions/Topics for this week:

- 2. In what areas of life do you find it most challenging to maintain undivided devotion to God?
- 3. How does understanding Jesus' victory over the enemy impact your approach to spiritual warfare and daily challenges? What steps can we take individually and as a group to assert the authority we have in Christ over the tactics of the enemy?

Be Intentional:
