Violence Turned to Mercy

Matthew 26:47-56

• The right <u>passion</u>, wrong <u>action</u>.

How did they miss the Savior?

Judas-The Betrayal

Luke 22:3, John 12:4-6, 1 Samuel 16:7

- We can be <u>near</u> the things of God without being <u>close</u> to God.
- He asked: "What's in it for me?"

Religious leaders-The Mock Trial

Matthew 26:57-68, Jeremiah 29:23-14, James 4:8, Joh 19:38-42

- They asked: "Who do you think you are?"
- They were motivated by pride more than God.

Pilate-The Rigged Trial

Matthew 26:39, 27:11-26, Luke 23:4

• He feared the <u>crowd</u> more than Christ.

The Crowd-The Jury

• They chose <u>culture</u> over Christ.

Our place in the story: Barabbas

Questions/Topics for this week:

- 1. Who you find yourself relating to most in the story (Peter, Judas, religious leaders, Pilate, Barabbas), and why?
- 2. How does how we perceive ourselves affect how we view God? How has your view of God changed over your lifetime, and why?
- 3. Why can it be so easy for us to choose culture over Christ? How can we safeguard ourselves against the culture having such an influence over us?
