What is God after?

Exodus 29:43–46

- God's heart has always been to dwell with His people

Glory That Transforms

Exodus 34; 2 Corinthians 3:16-18

- You cannot spend time in the presence of God and remain unchanged

A Prepared People

Exodus 35-36

- Grace redeems what rebellion wasted

A Finished Work

Exodus 39

- What God finishes, He fills

Glory Fills

Exodus 40; Psalms 24:7-10

- God's presence sets the pace of our lives

The Greater Tabernacle

John 1:14; 2 Corinthians 6:16; Matthew 28:20

- Salvation is God moving in, not just cleaning up

Small Group Questions:

1. Where are you most tempted to settle for *God's help* without pursuing *God's presence*? What might it look like for you to move from "God fixing things" to "God dwelling with me" in this season?
2. When others look at your life, what do you think reflects time spent with Jesus—and what might still be hidden behind a "veil"? How does this passage challenge the way we measure spiritual growth?
3. Where in your life are you doing the right things but quietly relying on effort instead of God's presence? How does the truth "*What God finishes, He fills*" reshape your expectations of obedience?

Be Intentional:

This week, set aside 10 uninterrupted minutes each day with no agenda—no list, no asking—just Scripture and quiet.

- Begin by praying: "*Lord, I'm not here to perform. I'm here to be with You.*"
- Read Exodus 29:45–46 or John 1:14 slowly.
- End by asking: "*How do You want Your presence to set the pace of my life today?*"

Pray:

Spend time praying together. What are some ways in which you can pray for each other? Take some time in the coming week to explore ways in which you can encourage one another. Remember to share with your group what you are learning about those opportunities and reflect on God's Word as you pray for each other.
