Me, not so much. I hate math. And I rarely use the word "hate" for anything. I remember some basic stuff from High School. I remember a few of the terms and I recognize a few symbols when I see them. I know **what** an equation looks like. I may even remember **how** to do a few equations if my life were on the line. To top it all off, once in a while, I remember **when** something has to be done in the equation.

What I don't understand is why.

For the life of me, I have never understood the **why** behind mathematics. Why certain things must be done in a specific order. Why some functions must be done first, no matter where they appear in an equation. I never understood **why** at all. I just focused on the **what, when, and how** to get it over with, solve the problem, and pass the class. It was miserable and I never enjoyed it.

Because I never understood why!

I believe many Christians don't grasp the **whys** of the Christian life. They know **what** to do and **how** to do it. They even understand **when** certain aspects of faith come into play or need to be performed. They get the mechanics of the faith. It's the **why**, the **purpose behind it all**, that they don't understand.

When this happens, we reduce the Christian life down to a list of holy dos and don'ts. Some divine checklist to be knocked out with the hope we get enough right to pass the test and earn our ticket to heaven. Worse yet, it takes the joy and passion out of Christian living and turns it into unfulfilling, meaningless drudgery. We just do the "God stuff" and go through the motions without ever understanding **why** we're doing it in the first place.

Starting in January, we're going to try to change that.

Our first sermon series for 2024 will be "Start with WHY." A series of messages designed to help us know and understand the reasons behind the things we do and believe. We want to rediscover our purpose and reignite our passion by understanding why.

We'll start on January 7th. I can't wait to share it with you!

Mission of the Month

NORTH EAST INDIA CHRISTIAN MISSION

NEICM was founded in 1974 by Dishington Sohkhlet. A Bible Institute, for adults, was started in the early days of the Mission. Dishington's dream of beginning a Christian school for children was realized in 1999. The school began as only a few grades but is now a K-12 school. The Christian school has over 700 students and 35 teachers spreading God's Word in NE India. After Dishington's death, his son, Billton, took over as director of NEICM. Billton graduated from Louisville Bible College in 2002.


NEICM's motto is "Bringing hope, meeting needs and providing a Christian World-View through sound Biblical instruction to the people of North East India as ambassadors for Christ." NEICM impacts NE India by working with 70 churches in NE India, working with village evangelists, distributing bibles, aiding in disasters, providing leadership training to area churches, continuing the "Living Water Project" of providing clean water, providing vaccinations, and in raising poultry to provide food.

Despite these success stories, the needs in India are still great and include salaries for teachers, staff, preachers, and evangelists. Immediate prayer needs are for funds for new dormitories, student sponsorship, water wells, a copy machine for office and tvs for students as well as Bibles, medical supplies, toilets, and many other things Americans take for granted. As with other parts of India, persecution of Christians and other minority religions continues to increase.

Ministry is made difficult when only 2.3% of the population is Christian. Hinduism makes up 79.8%, Islam 14.2%, and other religions make up the remaining 3.7% of India's population. Evangelism is also challenged by the fact that language barriers are common. Hindu and English are the major language but there are 15 other major languages and 844 dialects. Travel in India makes reaching the lost even more difficult as good roads are nonexistent outside larger cities. Many evangelists travel many miles on foot and a simple mope or motor bike is a great help to the ministry.
