### Where in the World is Pastor Mike?

As you read this article, please know that I will be embarking on an incredible journey to the beautiful and culturally rich country of Malawi, situated in the heart of South Central Africa. My trip spans from September 28 to October 8, and it involves a marathon 40-hour journey each way. While the travel may be arduous, it leads me to one of the most inspiring and resilient nation



me to one of the most inspiring and resilient nations in the world.

In Malawi, a staggering 94% of the population lacks access to electricity, and the majority of its people are sustenance farmers. Over the past 17 years, I've had the privilege of traveling to Malawi with mission teams, focused on providing education and support to these incredible communities.

During this visit, I am thrilled to be close to concluding a four-year Course of Study for 23 dedicated pastors. Ten of these pastors are proficient in English, so I have the honor of teaching them during the day. For the thirteen pastors who speak the native language Chichewa, I work with a translator during evening sessions. Completing this course is a significant milestone, equivalent to attending a seminary, and it propels them towards full ordination.

While my mission is to assist and make a positive impact in their lives, it's always humbling how much I receive from them in return. These pastors oversee anywhere from eight to thirty churches within their circuit, often traversing between them on foot, sometimes up to 20 miles apart. They subsist on meager incomes, with church offerings that may include items like sweet potatoes and chickens. Remarkably, many of these churches don't even have a building; their worship takes place under the shelter of a tree.

I am profoundly inspired and humbled by the remarkable resilience they display, accomplishing so much with so little. Their unwavering dedication to sharing the Good News, even in the face of numerous challenges, is truly awe-inspiring. Their joy-filled worship, with singing that resonates for miles, is a testament to their unwavering faith and spirit.

I invite you to locate Malawi on a map and kindly keep me in your thoughts and prayers as I embark on this journey, working tirelessly to shine God's glory through the illumination of His Word, as seen through the teachings of John Wesley. And most importantly, please pray for the people of Malawi. To them, even our poorest are seen as very rich people.

In this pursuit to enrich our children's lives, we're actually doing them a disservice. Their creativity, resiliency, and relationships end up suffering as a result.


And when we place an emphasis on temporary achievements over eternal ones, we show by example where our true value lies.




