

## Finding Rest In God

"Great are you, O Lord, and highly to be praised." Augustine, the great theologian and bishop of Hippo, opened his autobiography with these words. From the beginning, the reader understands that Augustine wants to frame his story within the praise due to God. Later on that same page comes what is perhaps his most famous line, "You rouse us to take delight in your praise, for you made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in you." Augustine's next several chapters describe how he attempted just the opposite. He tried to find ultimate delight in his childhood games, stealing pears, sexual immorality, empty philosophies, academic achievement, building wealth, and even close friendships. All of it failed. He ended up learning that "wherever man's soul turns itself, if it does not turn toward you (God), it is riveted to sorrows, indeed even if it is fastened upon beautiful things." And what was the reason he found for this? "For (the soul) longs to be and loves to take rest in what she loves. But no rest is to be found in such things, for they do not abide but, instead, are fleeting."

Psalm 48 begins with words very similar to Augustine's, "Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised in the city of our God!" I chose this Psalm for my first sermon at GBF in part because I wanted to answer a question concerning the purpose of our gathering, "Why do we come to church?" The answer from Psalm 48 is so that we may glorify God because he has revealed

himself to be a saving fortress. Through this metaphor, we understand that God has given us peace, security, and <u>rest</u>. Through the work of Christ, God established the Church to be forever secure in him. So, when we gather every Sunday, we respond with praise. The result is a beautiful back-and-forth dance of God-given rest inducing God-glorifying praise which settles our restless hearts all the more. It's why we were created. "You rouse us to take delight in your praise, for you made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in you."

Eventually, Augustine found his rest in God. Much later in his book he described the final moments before his conversion. He found the Bible open to Romans 13:13-14, "Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires." All doubt faded away for him. He no longer wondered where he might find rest. He found it in Christ alone. Even in the great sorrow of his mother's passing, which occurred after his conversion, Augustine found rest amidst his pain. Speaking to God, he wrote, "I let flow the tears that I had held back, allowing them to pour forth as much as they wished, resting my heart upon them and there finding rest, for they were let loose before your ears and not those of men."

Brothers and sisters, my hope for you is that any restlessness you feel in your hearts will cause you to turn to the Lord. See what he has done for you in Christ to make you secure, to bring you peace, and to put you at rest. May we respond with praise to his glorious grace! Let our prayer be that of Augustine's which he wrote near the end of his book:

"O Lord God, give us peace, for you have given us all things. Give us the peace of rest, the peace of the Sabbath, the peace that does not know the shadows of twilight."
