

The Enduring Love of the Lord

"I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore I have continued my faithfulness to you." Jeremiah 31:3b

Do you ever wonder how you will be able to persevere through this life? Are there times when it is difficult to grasp how you will endure the obstacles you face? In those moments, verses like Jeremiah 31:3 resonate in our hearts and provide comfort and hope.

The Lord called Jeremiah to be His prophet in a tumultuous part of Judah's history. The Babylonian empire was on the rise, and they deported God's people, destroyed the temple, and made it so Jeremiah would eventually be carried to Egypt. His task, however, was to relay God's message and call for repentance as God's people faced judgment. While Jeremiah is often known as the "weeping prophet," he also has portions in his book which tell of great hope the people can have for the future.

In Jeremiah 31, the Lord begins by relaying the past tribulation the people experienced. "The people who survived the sword" (31:2) served as a reminder of those who didn't survive the sword but died because of their sin. God's judgment fell justly on the people who rebelled against Him and refused to repent. The ones kept alive are said to have lived in the wilderness, away from their home and out of the Promised Land. The Lord uses Exodus imagery of the wilderness to describe the hardship of the survivors. The good news, however, is they "found grace in the wilderness" (31:2). How did they find grace? "When Israel sought for rest, the Lord appeared to him from far away" (31:2b-3a). They found grace in the presence of the gracious Lord, who appeared to them from far away. When they *sought* rest, they *found* grace in the appearance of the Lord. The only way they could make it through the wilderness was with the grace of the Lord sustaining, strengthening, and providing for them.

In light of this good news, the Lord speaks directly to His people. "I have loved you with an everlasting love" (31:3b). While He appeared to the people "from far away," He communicated closeness, nearness, and affection.

He loved them with gracious love. It wasn't because of anything they had done to deserve or earn His love. He loved them because of His good pleasure to keep His precious promises (Deut. 7:7-8). The Lord loved in a personal (I have loved) and an enduring (everlasting love) way. This direct communication of His love to His people serves as the ground for the assurance of His continued faithfulness to them. What is the guarantee of His faithfulness? It is His everlasting love. The Lord would not fail or forsake them because His love cannot be thwarted, slowed, or stopped.

How are you going to go on? Is it not by the same everlasting love which assures you of God's continued faithfulness in whatever you face? Hear these words again from our Lord today, "I have loved you with an everlasting love." You can know this everlasting love because it is displayed in the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). His love saves, sanctifies, sustains, and supports you so you live for Him. Whatever you are enduring, dear Christian, God loves you, and nothing will separate you from His love.

"For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:38-39

I pray to Jesus, but Jesus takes a very long time to reply to my prayers, but the witchdoctor answers my prayer quickly." How would you respond to this woman?

Glynn and I travel to Africa for most of July. It's wonderful traveling with my wife this time! We'll be in Cape Town where I'll teach a missiology course at the Bible Institute of South Africa. And then to Maputo, Mozambique to coordinate and preach at our annual church leaders' conference with Brazilian book publisher Editora Fiel.

Our son Cole married the wonderful Shoshanna last Saturday. It was such a great celebration for this young and godly couple.

Last Saturday, God gave us the opportunity to speak to these pastors on the subject of "The wisdom and grace to deal with difficult church members." Some of my points were:

- Seek the wisdom and grace to take care of yourselves first (Acts 20:28). Sometimes, we (pastors) are not easy to deal with.
- Seek the wisdom and grace to remember that we are not mere volunteers, but servants commissioned by God to do the ministry (Act 20:24)!
- Seek the wisdom and grace to learn that criticism and opposition is inevitable (1 Pt.2:21-23)!
- Seek the wisdom and grace to get rid of any root of bitterness (Heb.12:15)!
