

Give Thanks to the Lord With Your Whole Heart

Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever. Give thanks to the God of gods, for His steadfast love endures forever. Give thanks to the Lord of lords, for His steadfast love endures forever. Give thanks to the God of heaven, for His steadfast love endures forever. Psalm 136:1-3, 26

Psalm 136 is a psalm of thanksgiving. From beginning to end, it heralds praise to the Lord for all He has done and the many ways He has blessed His people. The first three verses set the stage by commanding the worshiper to give thanks to the Lord, and in each, the psalmist varies the title used for God. First, we give thanks to Yahweh (translated the LORD). He is the great I AM, who was, is, and always will be. It reminds us of how God revealed Himself to Moses in Exodus 3:14-15, "God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'I AM has sent me to you.'" God also said to Moses, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'The LORD, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you.' This is my name forever, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations." Second, we give thanks to the God of gods. He is the only God we are to worship because He is the only living God. All other so-called "gods" are idols, both dead and lifeless (1 Cor. 8:5-6). Third, He is the Lord of lords. We give thanks to Him, who rules over all. His Kingdom cannot fail, and it is ultimately established by Jesus, pictured in Revelation as having "King of kings" and "Lord of lords" written upon His thigh (Rev. 19:16). In our thanksgiving, we remember we give thanks to someone. When we take time to think about what we are thankful for, it is necessary first to think of Him to whom we are giving thanks. He is Yahweh, the God of gods, and the Lord of lords.

After instructing us to whom we give thanks, the psalmist then gives us reasons why we give thanks to Him. The first reason we give thanks is because God is good. The definition and standard of goodness are bound to God's person. We would not know what is good if God were not good. When we give thanks, do we consider God's goodness? If we struggle to be thankful, it may be imperative for us to meditate on His goodness and how He has been good to us in our lives.

The next reason to give thanks is repeated 26 times in the psalm (one time in each verse). Give thanks to the Lord because His steadfast love endures forever. God's steadfast love can also be translated as "lovingkindness," "mercy," or simply as "love." The word describes a loyal and unfailing love, often used to describe the covenantal

love the Lord has with His people. In the middle of Psalm 136 (verses 4-25), we read about how the Lord demonstrated His enduring steadfast love to His people. Such repetition reminds us that our thankfulness to the Lord will never cease because His love towards us will never end. There is never a day we should not be thankful, especially knowing the epitome of God's lovingkindness in the cross of Christ. "But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).


Finally, the psalmist caps off the song by directing our thankfulness to the God of heaven (vs. 36). He is sovereign and above all things. While imminently involved in our lives, we remember He is the transcendent God, who is seated on high and whose glory is above the heavens (Psalm 113:4-5). We give thanks to the One who is in control and providentially orchestrating all things according to the purpose of His will. Let us then continually give thanks to the Lord with our whole heart and seek to magnify the splendor and majesty of His works (Psalm 111:1-3).







