Dear church friends,

Do you ever think about why we celebrate New Year's Day? It's really just another day, so why is it so important to mark a date change on a calendar?

It's because a new year offers a new beginning, the chance to get a fresh start. There's a reason January is the most important month of the year for gyms and self-help programs, because it seems like a chance to start again, to improve ourselves. It seems like a natural time for beginning something, which is why lots of us will make New Year's resolutions (whether we stick to them or not is another story!).

The Christian life offers many opportunities for fresh starts, changing what we've been doing, or beginning to live differently. Each week in worship, we begin with a time of confession where we admit what we've done wrong. We admit to God and to each other that our lives are not perfect, that we're not living the way we ought to live, that we're doing things we ought not do and failing to do things we ought to do.

Then, immediately after confession, we hear God's response. We hear the good news that because of God's forgiveness, because God loves us, we all get a fresh start. Psalm 103:12 says God has taken our sins away from us "as far as the east is from the west." The slate is wiped clean. We don't need to carry the weight of our sins or guilt with us anymore. We are forgiven!

And then we run into the next week (or maybe just the next day...or the next couple of minutes!) and it doesn't take long before we sin again. It doesn't take long to forget what God has done for us. But we always have another opportunity to remember God's love. God never gets tired of forgiving us!

In The Small Catechism, Martin Luther said we ought to begin each day in this way:

"In the morning, as soon as you get out of bed, you are to make the sign of the holy cross and say: 'God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit watch over me. Amen.' Then, kneeling or standing, say the Apostle's Creed and the Lord's Prayer...After singing a hymn, or whatever else may serve your devotion, you are to go to your work joyfully." You don't have to wait til January 1st of a new year to get a fresh start on life. Every day offers the opportunity to wake up and remember that you are a baptized child of God. You have been claimed, redeemed, and set free by Jesus Christ.

After hearing the promise of forgiveness and absolution in worship, we continue the only way we can, by together giving thanks to God in song and by hearing more about God's grace and love for us, and by receiving the means of grace in the Holy Communion.

So, every day is a fresh start in God's grace, by personally remembering our baptisms. Every Sunday is a fresh start for us when we worship together, and receive God's grace in the Word and the sacrament of Holy Communion. No need to wait for next January. See you in worship, where every Sunday is a new beginning.

I wish you a joyful and safe start to 2024.



As you may recall, during the congregational meeting held in June regarding the church budget, the decision was made to remove the purchase of the projector for the sanctuary from the annual budget and establish a Capital Campaign to fund the purchase. Following that meeting, the Worship Team agreed to lead the campaign for the projector. This campaign has been approved by the church council and is moving forward with raising the necessary funds. The Worship Team strongly believes that a projector in the sanctuary will provide us with a means to enhance worship in ways we are currently unable to do as well as have a positive economic and environmental impact by reducing the costs associated with the producing the bulletin in its current form. The overall cost of the projector and associated equipment will be +/- \$7500. Thanks to some generous donations and fundraising, \$2933.90 has already been added to the fund. Please consider targeting a donation toward the purchase of the projector. Also, look for fundraisers in the future to help us reach our target and add this additional piece of technology to our worship experience.

Total income through the end of November is higher than last year and higher than what we anticipated. Keep in mind though that almost \$60,000 of it came via an IRS refund for the Employee Retention Credit and a payout from a life insurance policy.

Total expenses through the end of November are greater than last year but less than the budget.

The month of November alone shows our expenses exceeded our income by \$9096.00. Our expenses are higher than our income for the year through the end of November by \$73,261.00. Neither of those figures, naturally, are an indication of good financial health.

Our total cash reserves are at \$473,424. This includes all the money in our accounts at Fulton Bank, Raymond James, Riverfront Federal Credit Union, and the Endowment Fund.

The finance committee is working hard on putting things together to present to the church council and ultimately to you, the congregation. There are many very tough decisions to be made. We hope you keep us in your prayers so what is put forward will be the best we can hope for as our church tries to move forward in a positive manner.

News from Council

Your church Council met on December 19th. The following are highlights of the discussion and actions. At this meeting, Council:

- -Discussed chapter 5 of Giving to God, which focused on faithful giving. We need to continue to share the message of stewardship. We will be asking the congregation for their opinion on a pledge campaign, perhaps using the word desire instead of pledge.
- -Learned the Personnel Committee is working on meeting with staff to update job descriptions and further understand their ministry work.
- -Determined the Church Administrative Assistant position will be budgeted for 20 hours per week beginning January 1st, maintaining current office hours.
- -Learned the Wi-Fi extenders in the sanctuary and office level are malfunctioning and will need to be replaced to restore reliable internet connect ability.
- -Approved the purchase of additional cameras to be placed at all facility doors to enhance security. The visitor log will be utilized during office hours only with the purpose of ensuring that visitors enter and exit at the office door.
- -Determined we will be donating the couch that was removed from the room off the fellowship hall which has served as a health suite but is now used for candy fundraising. The parking lot stage will be dismantled and disposed of.
- -Learned the Care Team assembled 18 care bags which will all be distributed by Christmas, with the help of the congregation.
- -Heard that the Learn Team discussed ways to encourage preschool family engagement and also discussed the Deacon's position in support of their ministry work.
- -Learned the Serve Team is going to be highlighting the monthly designated mission envelop recipient for more congregational visibility.
- -Learned the Worship Team is assembling a small group to explore adding a worship service with an alternative format.
- -Reviewed the most recent Budget Proposal from the Finance Committee and continued to discuss budget cutting options.


