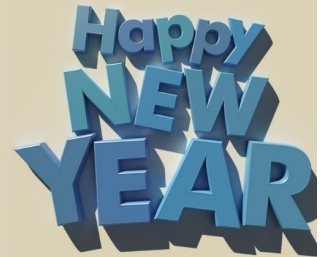

A Message from Pastor Rolf

What does God require of us?

Every morning, I peruse the news articles and top stories. It can get overwhelming. ICE raids, wars in places like Ukraine and Syria, the capture of Maduro, the economy, budget cuts, court cases, and measles outbreaks are but a few of the latest headlines.

Whatever your stance on any of these topics, what God requires of us is the same:

Micah 6:8: "He has told you what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

No matter who you are, your circumstances, your opinions, your achievements, or your childhood, God wants us to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with our God.

Justice can mean a crime that has not been made right. Justice can also mean unfairness in life. Where has someone had fewer opportunities than others? Is someone struggling or suffering? Do you have any means or opportunity to help? Where can you speak up for another who cannot speak for themselves? Where can you lift someone out of suffering?

Kindness is compassion. Kindness is not seeking your own good above another. Kindness is not pressing your rights at the expense of another. Kindness is gentleness and goodness shared. Where can you be kind?

What does it mean to walk humbly with your God? To walk with someone means to spend time with them in their presence. To be humble with God is to know what it **cost** Him for us to know Him. It cost Jesus His life because each of us is selfish, sinful, and broken. None of us could save ourselves; we are all unworthy. God so loved us that He gave His one and only Son to die on our behalf so that we could live.

Let us remember His sacrifice and love and walk humbly in a daily relationship with Him. Walking with God each day, bringing Him our worries about the ups and downs, is also our source of strength and peace to do justice and love kindness.

2025 financials ended in a much better place than prior-year actual and budget. St. John's revenue in 2025 exceeded 2024 in most categories. Combined giving (general plus targeted) was higher than 2024! An upward trend year-over-year is a big deal after many years of giving decline. "Other income" exceeded the prior year by \$10,584 mostly due to renting the former youth room to Full Throttle Fitness Factory and renting out the sanctuary for a candlelight concert series this past fall. Fundraising continues to be strong bringing in \$21,266 in 2025.

Even though expenses were down by \$40,000 in 2025 compared to 2024, expenses still exceed revenue. Expenditures are consistently reviewed by staff and Council. Property repairs have been an ongoing challenge given the age and size of the Church's infrastructure. The property team has identified several items that need attention in the near future. In the 2026 budget, the congregation approved securing a line of credit to assist with the financing of larger repairs.

Genesis continues to be a wonderful mission of the church. Genesis tuition covers all direct expenses of the ministry. As the vision process moves forward here at St. John's, I pray that focusing on the needs of our community bring us clarity and renewal in 2026.

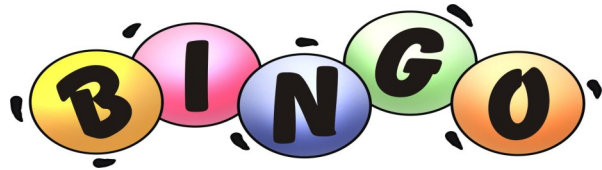

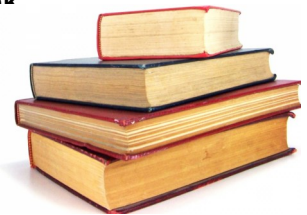

WILSON AREA FOOD PANTRY NEWS

The Wilson Area Food Pantry served 125 families (474 individuals) in November and in December we served 98 families (389 individuals). We embark on a new year with the January 16 food distribution to help our neighbors.

We primarily serve the Wilson School District and Wyomissing area. Seven churches work together to serve the community with money donations and nonperishable food donations.

YOUR church donations to the pantry are vital to the support that we can give to the families in need. We thank all for the peanut butter, mac & cheese, cereal plus whatever you can give which are bagged for handouts. Our dependence on the donations from our supporting 7 churches is even more important than ever as the need grows and Helping Harvest funding is being reduced.

The pantry needs donations of nonperishable food items. The pantry especially needs donations of

1. Canned fruits
2. Canned vegetables
3. Pasta sauce or tomato sauce
4. Spaghetti
5. Canned meats especially canned tuna, spam, or chicken
6. Peanut butter
7. Canned soup
8. Mac and cheese

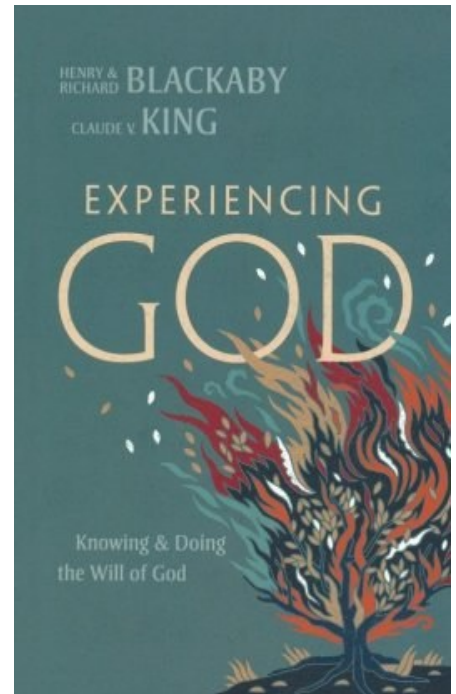
