November greetings!

Meanwhile, our world is heating up with conflict and the people of war-torn regions are with-

The juxtaposition of these realities has me asking myself what I am thankful for this year in rather deeper ways. How about you?

Saint Paul's words to his friend, Timothy, are a reminder of the blessing of humbly being content just to have clothes and food. Paul's point is that when it all comes down to it, we do not take anything with us into heaven. Instead of chasing after more for ourselves, can we be humbly content with the food on our tables, the clothing we have, and the home where we dwell?

Paul's challenge of contentment isn't just an opportunity to evaluate ourselves. It is also a thankful act of counting our blessings. By extension, contentment also opens us to the freedom of giving generously to others. This is because being content with what we have diminishes the temptation to want more. Generosity can spring free from our souls when we are content with what we have and cease to hoard for ourselves in want of more. I think Paul would appreciate the bumper sticker slogan; *Happiness isn't having what we want. It's wanting what we have.* There is a great gain in godliness with contentment, for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world. But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content.

1 Timothy 6:6-8 ESV

My friends, God has put this challenge of contentment before me this month. If, by reading this, you sense that God is challenging you to be more content, then join me in this spiritual walk this month of Thanksgiving. Let me know, and we can commit to praying each day for one another. We can be sure that God is going to walk us through it, and our journey will be joyful and generous.

In the month of November we are invited by society to consider all that we are thankful for as we approach the national holiday of Thanksgiving. Many spend time on Thanksgiving Day sharing what they have been most thankful for in the last year. Around tables we



might hear thanks for family, good health, a new job, house, or car, a financial windfall, a new pet, the list goes on.

It is absolutely right and good that we take moments (even at times other than a national holiday where it has become almost expected) to be thankful for all of the good things in our lives. Being thankful can help us to appreciate the people, things, and situations of our lives more fully. Acknowledging all that is good can help us to see and feel better about ourselves and the lives we are living. Some say that GRATITUDE is taking THANKFULNESS a step further, from a thought or feeling to a deed or action. "Gratitude is a positive emotion that involves being thankful and appreciative and is associated with several mental and physical health benefits. When you experience gratitude, you feel grateful for something or someone in your life and respond with feelings of kindness, warmth, and other forms of generosity.*"

Martin Luther referred to gratitude as "the basic Christian attitude" and today it is still referred to as "the heart of the gospel". Christians are encouraged to praise and give gratitude to their creator. In Christian gratitude, God is seen as the selfless giver of all good things and, because of this, gratefulness enables Christians to share a common bond, shaping all aspects of a follower's life. Gratitude in Christianity is an acknowledgement of God's generosity that inspires Christians to shape their own thoughts and actions around such ideals.


As you may recall, during the congregational meeting held in June regarding the church budget, the decision was made to remove the purchase of the projector for the sanctuary from the annual budget and establish a Capital Campaign to fund the purchase. Following that meeting, the Worship Team agreed to lead the campaign for the projector. This campaign has been approved by the church council and is moving forward with raising the necessary funds. The Worship Team strongly believes that a projector in the sanctuary will provide us with a means to enhance worship in ways we are currently unable to do as well as have a positive economic and environmental impact by reducing the costs associated with the producing the bulletin in its current form. The overall cost of the projector and associated equipment will be +/-\$7500. Thanks to some generous donations, \$775 has already been added to the fund. Please consider targeting a donation toward the purchase of the projector. Also, look for fundraisers in the future to help us reach our target and add this additional piece of technology to our worship experience.

September Treasurer's Report

Back in May we filed an Employee Retention Credit application (ERC) with the federal government. It had to deal with retention of employees during the Covid timeframe. The refunds, 5 of them, were to be paid to us based on the quarter of the year they pertained to. To date, we have received 4 of those 5 refund checks, totaling \$54,729.57. The accountant that did the work, Forrest Glass, agreed to take 89.5% of his bill. That amount is \$6,550.00. The 89.5% is roughly equal to the amount of the total refund we have received. He is certain we will eventually receive the last refund check, though, at the current time, is delayed by more than a month. At the time we receive that final check, we will pay him the final amount due. You will see this money as part of the Bequest line.

One of our annuities came "Out of Surrender" on August 21st. Council decided not to renew it but rather take the cash, \$61,637.05, and deposit it into a local CD paying a higher interest than what the renewed annuity would have paid us. This location has yet to be approved by council, but I will be requesting that it be Riverfront Federal Credit Union. Total income is above budget, however that is due mainly the effect of the ERC refunds. General Fund Giving is higher than 2022. Genesis continues to shine with income well above expected.

Total Expenses are lower than budget but higher than 2022. In good news, Unbudgeted Expenses are about 57% less than last year.

We have a finance committee working on the 2024 budget. We are hoping to have it to show you in November. We'll try our best!

Our Congregational Council last met on October 17th. At this meeting Council:

• Continued our study of Giving to God. This meeting we considered stewardship as an expression of faith and a spiritual discipline.

• Determined that we will present a 3 month/first quarter budget, at the same levels currently, to the congregation during the November 19th Congregational Meeting. This will give us time to grapple with the hard decisions we need to make regarding what ministries, facilities improvements, and personnel our congregation can afford to support.

• Discussed the remote work trial period for our Office Administrator, Lexie McLaughlin. Lexie will be working evenings to fulfill those responsibilities that can be completed remotely. We have asked for volunteers to serve as receptionists during scheduled office hours during this trial period, which continues until December 31st.

• Learned the new Finance Committee has met and the new Personnel Committee will meet in the next week to begin their work.

• Scheduled Spaghetti Dinners for the community on October 26th and November 20th. The free will offering from these dinners will be credited to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.

• Approved a Peppermint Bark and Peanut Clusters candy sale fundraiser to be led by Deb Scheidt and Barb Stoner. Proceeds will be credited to the video projector fund.

• Reviewed the discussion outline for the October 22nd Congregational Conversation and set the date for the next conversation to be November 19th. There will not be Congregational Conversation in December.

• Learned Lexie is now sending weekly announcements of "happenings" at St. John's in to the Reading Eagle for publishing.

• Implemented the use of Giving Cards during the offering to encourage an offering by those who do not have an offering envelope to place in the plate. This is intended to remind congregants that the offering is an act of worship, not simply budgetary support. Giving can be time, talent and treasures.

Learned the new fire and security alarm system installation is coming soon.
