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## WHO is ELIGIBLE?

Any junior high students in the sixth, seventh, or eighth grades as of January 1, 2020 are eligible to participate in this serve trip. You do not have to be currently attending our youth group.

## WHAT will we DO?

Possibilities include: removing invasive plant species, picking up brush and piling it up, cabin clean-up, working on the horse ranch, cleaning up the waterfront, stacking firewood, mending fences, etc. You'll be surprised at how much fun you'll have in the process. We will work during the day on Saturday and play in the evening.

## HOW much does it COST?

The registration fee is a nominal \$40.00. Students are provided transportation to and from Camp Timber-lee. Dinner Friday night, breakfast, lunch, and dinner Saturday, and breakfast Sunday is included. Lodging Friday and Saturday nights is included in the camp cabins. Participants will need to have some cash in their pockets for any refreshments they may want to purchase during potential travel stops. Also there is a camp store.

## HOW to make it HAPPEN

- Must have a mature attitude and be willing to give up your wants and desires for 3 days for the needs of others. This is a “work trip”, not recreational experience. But, we will have fun working and hanging out together.
- Must be in good physical and emotional health.
- Register online at [cbfministries.org](http://cbfministries.org). Click on “Work Camp JrHi”.
- We cannot refund registration fees.
- There will be a limit to how many people can go.
- First deadline for signing up is April 1, 2020.
- Secure a half-day excused absence from school on Friday.
- We will depart from the junior high back parking lot at 1:00 p.m.
- Your parents should drop your baggage off at the Impact Center Friday morning between 6:30 a.m. and noon.
- Pack work clothes for Saturday and clean clothes for the ride home on Sunday. Long pants like jeans should be worn on Saturday. You can wear shorts and more casual clothes Saturday night. Shorts should be at least finger-tip length. Shirts should have short or long sleeves.
- Pack a sleeping bag or blanket, pillow, towel, soap, toothbrush and toothpaste, deodorant, meds and any other toiletry items you need.
- Must have work shoes for Saturday. They can be tennis shoes. No sandals.
- Pack cash if you think you're going to make purchases.
- Very important—pack good work gloves. Not those thin gardening gloves.
- You may take snacks for travel and in the cabin.
- Keep baggage to a minimum. Try not to use baggage larger than carry-on size.
- No cell phones or electronic devices are allowed.
