UPDATE FROM THE JUNE MEETING

July 2023

"'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.' So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me." -2 Corinthians 12:9

The 36th annual Delaware-Maryland Synod Assembly was held June 9-10, 2023 at Grace Lutheran Church in Westminster, Maryland. The more than 360 voting members gathered to conduct business crucial to our life and ministry together. In addition to approving reports and measures such as the minutes from last year's Assembly, the financial audit, the 2024 Faith Spending Plan, and more, the Assembly considered and passed the following actions:

The election of Jada Wright (Jerusalem, Baltimore) as our new Synod Vice President.

The election of members of the Consultation Committee [David Magoon (Grace, Hockessin) and the Rev. Zachary Wright (Bethel, North East)] and the Discipline Committee [April Parvizian (Epiphany, Baltimore) and the Rev. Kelley Ketcham (St. Mark's Wilmington)].

The ratification of the Rev. Christopher Schaefer (Divinity, Towson) as Team Leader for the Communications Team, fulfilling the term of Daniel Mambu (transferred to the Lower Susquehanna Synod, with thanks for his ministry).

The adoption of three resolutions:

Resolution 2023-1: Global Church Sunday.

Resolution 2023-2: Compensation Guidelines.

Resolution 2023-3: Promoting Transgender Competency in the Delaware-Maryland Synod.

The Assembly was able to offer its gratitude, on behalf of our entire synod, to outgoing Vice President John Auger (Grace, Hockessin). Just a few highlights of his two terms include our successful Forward in Faith capital campaign and the establishment of the Synod Local Ministry Fund; implementation of the Vision 2018 plan and its accompanying restructuring effort; frequent road trips with Bishop Gohl to visit and engage with each conference; an increased focus on adaptive leadership; and a commitment to the development of lay leaders, especially throughout the pandemic. In his final report to the Assembly, John reflected, "As I look back over the past 40 years of leadership that I've been involved in, both in congregations and in business, I can say without a doubt that my time serving as Synod Vice President has been the most fun, satisfying, and impactful experience as a leader." As a synod, we give thanks for the incredible ministry of John Auger, and express our deep gratitude for his work among us.

While reports and action items occupy the bulk of a Synod Assembly agenda, we were reminded throughout the Assembly that we cannot gather to do the work of the church without keeping our faith at the center. Our Bible study leader, the Rev. Dr. Surekha Nelavala (Global Peace, Frederick), encouraged us to dig into often-uncomfortable texts, examining our privilege alongside the boundlessness of God as we consider how and to whom we might extend grace. The Assembly began and ended in worship, anchoring our work together in the name of the one who calls us to it. Our Synod Worship Team guided us on a marvelous journey through the new Evangelical Lutheran Worship supplement, *All Creation Sings* (of which each Assembly attendee received a copy!) and the Rev. Harvard Stephens primed the pump for the task ahead, reminding us that "the Spirit is moving among us. We are trusting in the Lord to lead us and guide us as we journey. God is on our side, and is leading this synod." To close out the Assembly, the people of Grace Lutheran Church capped off their incredible hospitality with spirited worship led by the Grace Praise Singers and Praise Band.

As Bishop Gohl remarked in his report to the Assembly, "While so many siblings across this church are measuring the pandemic by their losses, we come with an embarrassment of riches." While we have much work to do together in the coming days, we are grounded in our commitment to walk this road together, connected to one another in faith, hope, love, and the God whose grace is sufficient.







Signup Genuis Instructions

Want to be a Genius?





Figure 1: Opening page of SignUp Genuis on a mobile phone after downloading the application on your phone.

St Paul's uses SignUp Genius® for the Worship Assistants calendar – for assisting ministers, lectors, communion set up/clean up, acolytes, ushers/ greeters, and tech helpers. We have a subscription so there are no ads on our sign-ups, however, if you are using a computer, you may still see ads from your browser; you don't see ads in the phone app. You can sign up with or without your own account. First download (see figure1 next page) the Signup Genius app or click on the link that the office sends out for Signup Genius. To sign up for a free account, simply provide your name, email address and a password of your choosing, while also proving that you're not a robot. Several steps are streamlined by having an account, such as automatically

adding signups to your calendar. You don't get extra emails from Signup

Genius, only reminders of upcoming duties from St. Paul's, and you can request that they don't sell your information. The office can sign you up if you don't do email or cell phone signups. You can see what slots are open and who else has signed up. The church's subscription also automatically removes dates from the past.




Figure 2: Example of a displayed signup for Worship Assistants. The available items to sign up for such as Lector/Communion Helper.




Figure 3: Example of showing all those "signed up" for various duties on Sunday July 16th

To sign up, simply scroll through the calendar and select the duty(ies) for particular service(s), (see figure 2 next page) and after selecting all, hit the "Submit & Sign Up" button (see figure 3 next page). If you have an account and are logged in, your name and email will automatically populate; if you don't have an account, you'll have to type it in each time. You can display an alternate name, which means you can sign up for yourself or someone in your family. Complete the process by hitting the "Sign Up Now!" button.

The church office emails everyone in the congregation the link to the "Worship Assistants" https://www.signupgenius.com/go/10C0D45ADAA2DA0FCC07-worship2 sign up weekly. Without the link, you can easily find it, by clicking on the magnifying glass icon or the "Find a Sign Up" button at the bottom of the screen, and enter the church's email, office@stpaulslutheran.info. If you've signed up before, then you'll see it if you're logged in under Signups you've been "Invited To".



Thursday, February 22, 1973

Local lass' vigil ends, her POW made it back.

When Captain Jeremiah Andrew Denton, a prisoner of war, since July 1965 stepped off the plane at Clark Air Force Base in the Philippines last week, one local heart beat faster.

The heart belonged to 19 year old Martha Susan lager of Fulton.

Since the summer, Martha had been wearing Dentons' POW Red Cross Bracelet, wondering if the man whose name she wore had any chance of being returned to this country alive.

Working as a candy striper at the Montgomery General Hospital (Mead Star, Olney) where she has put in 500 volunteer hours, Martha was one of many girls and boys who participated in the POW bracelet program. The money they contributed was used by the Red Cross to supply food and necessities to the captured men.

She says she constantly worried to herself about Denton. She and the other candy stripers would often talk about the names on the bracelets they wore, if they returned, what about their families — the doubt — the anguish—the waiting.

She talked about his fate with her fellow students at Palotti High School. She discussed it with her parents, the Charles lagers of Fulton.

In her small way, Martha has shared all the uncertainties. Little did she dream the months she carried his name he would be the first POW to descend the ramp and tell the world television audience: "We are honored to serve our country under difficult circumstances. God Bless America!"

The Denton's family has grown while he has been imprisoned. In reading the newspaper account of the returning prisoners, Martha discovered Denton's oldest son (the Denton's have seven children) served as a pilot while his father was gone. The Denton's youngest daughter, 18 months old when her father was captured has grown up while her father was away. It will be quite a reunion for them, Martha muses.

I thought it fitting to remember those who served and are those still Lost this July 4th.


