

• In September of 2017 a Category 5 Hurricane – Maria --- devastated the Island of Puerto Rico. For 39 hours 3.4 million citizens of Puerto Rico endured 155 mile an hour winds and heavy rain. The storm left the 3.4 million residents without electricity, water and communications. The physical damage was catastrophic but more devastating was the fact that over 3,000 people lost their lives 5 days after the storm more than half of the 3.4 million citizens were still without water. Water shortages still occur 7 years later due to Puerto Rico's slow progress in modernizing it's water infrastructure. Hurricane Maria caused a complete collapse of Puerto Rico's electrical systems – leading to one of the longest blackouts in US history.








