PASTOR SEARCH UPDATE: HELP SHAPE OUR MISSION AND MINISTRY

The Session wanted to update the congregation on where we are in the process and the Next Steps to be taken. Right now we are getting ready to complete #1.


- 1.TPC's Session has reviewed the 2022 Topsail Presbyterian Survey to verify that the results are still current and submitted their responses including their futuristic goals.
- 2.TPC's Session has authorized a Transitional Ministry Team (TMT) to conduct a final survey to the congregation on items not included in the 2022 survey (what characteristics in a pastor do you want, etc.). This will be chaired by Elder Tom Sidbury.
- 3. The Session and TMT will take the results from the Session responses, and the results from the congregation survey and create a new Mission Statement or affirm our current Statement. This will then be used on the Mission Discernment Profile (MDP) (This will be used later in the PCUSA's Church Leadership Connection (CLC) software system.)
- 4. At the completion of the Mission Study, the Session will request permission from ECOM to form a Pastor Nominating Committee. (PNC)

We are aiming to distribute the follow-up survey in August, both electronically and in paper form, to ensure broad participation and accessibility. Everyone's voice matters—whether you've been a member for decades or have only recently joined the congregation. The survey is your opportunity to help guide the future direction of our ministries and shape the pastoral leadership we seek. More details will be shared as the survey launch date approaches. Please watch for announcements in worship, email, and on social media—and make sure your voice is heard.

Thanks to the generosity of the Session and congregation of Topsail Presbyterian Church, our music staff spent an enriching week at the Montreat conference center for the annual Presbyterian Association of Musicians' Music and Worship Conference. The week was filled with both educational and musical events and opportunities. Highlights included beautiful worship services, diverse classes such as conducting and organ improvisation, and performance opportunities.

The conference is led by highly skilled clinicians and musicians. Musical groups included a children's choir, middle school choir, two high school choirs, and two adult choirs. These groups rehearse each day of the clinic, learning choral anthems that can be used in their church communities. Handbell choirs abound at Montreat and are easily one of the most popular groups in which to participate! This year, there were five choirs of different levels meeting each day. It's not just about performing, but learning both new music and new ways to present and instruct.

Organ classes were presented both in literature – what's new, what's available, etc. – and in improvisation – techniques to heighten hymn playing and versatility. The organists who played for services and instructed were a true inspiration. Organists of every level were present, and everyone could benefit from the well-structured offerings.

The final evening of concerts is always a special event, where the hard work of all is highlighted and shared. Rebecka played the oboe with different ensembles, performed with a handbell ensemble, and sang in the choir. Shelly added her harp to the wind ensemble offering. It was an uplifting concert.

The beauty of Montreat remains inspiring, despite the damage caused by Hurricane Helene last fall. A special museum exhibit was opened concerning the devastating floods, complete with actual videos of the storm, stories of survivors and renovation efforts. Restoration of the conference center on Montreat College is just about complete and Lake Susan looks beautiful! The bigger picture of devastation remains, with roads still closed and much rebuilding to be done throughout the area, including Swannanoa. One highlight this year was the bears! While we kept our distance, watching the mama and her three cubs was very entertaining!

We are deeply grateful to the congregation and Session for allowing us to be nourished both musically and spiritually at Montreat.


