WHO USES OUR FACILITY? BY LAURIE RUCKS

That is a good question. Let's see if we can shed some light on how our facilities are being used!

Monday through Thursday, Topsail Preschool utilizes our Sunday School rooms, Fellowship Hall, sanctuary for chapel, and the playground in good weather. The children are dropped off at 9 a.m. and picked up at 12:30 p.m. Each child brings their own lunch. Preschool follows the Pender County School calendar for holidays and days off.

Every Monday and Thursday, we have an AA meeting in our Fellowship Hall. This is a wide variety of people and is extremely well attended. Every Monday and Thursday, we have an Al-Anon meeting in the Youth Building. Again this is a very well-attended meeting.

Mondays we also have Handbell practice at 6 p.m., followed by choir practice at 7 p.m. The exception is the third Monday of the month, when Session meets; there are no practices.

Tuesdays September through May, we have Tuesday Night Kids Club. The children are dropped off at 5:30 and the parents pick them up at 7. We feed them at 6:30 a variety of evening meals, including hot dogs, pancakes/waffles (breakfast for dinner), pizza, and chicken nuggets. Yes dessert too! The children utilize the Fellowship Hall, Sunday School rooms, and the sanctuary.

Wednesdays, we have Troop 235 meetings in the Fellowship Hall, Sunday School rooms, and the Youth Building. When they have their Court of Honor, they utilize our Fellowship Hall. Several times a year, they have a potluck for the families and the scouts, usually on a Saturday.

Sunday evenings we have our Youth meeting in the Youth Building.

The first Thursday of the month at noon, we have the Lions Club that meets in Fellowship Hall.

The third Saturday of the month at 8:30 we have Meals on Wheels. They prepare food and transport the items to members of our community who are shut in. This is a rewarding experience and is always in need of additional volunteers.

The third Thursday of the month, PEO meets in our Youth Building. PEO stands for Philanthropic Educational Organization. This is a sisterhood that promotes celebrating, empowering, and motivating women. Their mission is to advance women through education around the world.

The third Monday of the month, the Hampstead Garden Club meets in Fellowship Hall. This is a group of avid gardeners from Hampstead.

The third Monday of the month, Session meetings are at 6 p.m. in the Gathering Room.

Girl Scout Leadership meetings will be held every other month once a month in the Gathering Room, dates to be determined next month. This does not interfer with Boy Scouts.

Various committee meetings are held on different days of the week and evening.

You can take pride in the fact that TPC is actively engaged in our community and that our outreach efforts continue to flourish.

PRESCHOOL GIVES BACK BY LAURIE RUCKS

The Preschool is bestowing a generous gift of \$10,000 upon TPC as a token of gratitude for the mission of our Church. The Finance Committee has allocated this contribution to the Strategic Vision Fund within our budget.

The Preschool has given back to TPC in additional ways over the years. The playground is maintained by Preschool funds, providing mulch each year and additional playground equipment when required.

The Preschool has also allocated funds for the painting of each individual classroom. They have financed the installation of flooring in the hallway. Additionally, they are tasked with the daily maintenance of their classrooms, which includes the thorough cleaning of the rugs situated on their classroom floors.

TPC furnishes essential utilities for the Preschool and provides the necessary space for its operations. This partnership has flourished over the course of 15 years.

Our Director, Marissa Watson, is constantly improving our program. This year, she initiated Soccer Shots, which is a program that provides basic skill training for preschool children. This is taught on the church grounds immediately after dismissal at about 12:30. She also invited Ecological Marine Adventures to visit our Preschool monthly to educate the children about reptiles, fossils, and other marine life. Each year, the children are introduced to various career professionals and community helpers. This year they had a pilot, doctor, physical therapist, postman, and firemen, of course, with their fire truck! TPC teachers and aids are required to participate in teacher training, and this year it was all about STEM/STEAM. The children are very engaged in these new adventures and learning tools.

The most important learning tool of all is about Jesus. Our preschool plants the seeds of Christian faith in each of our students when they participate in weekly chapel.


