
We're collecting candy donations now, and we'd love to have more trunks and volunteers involved. Let us know if you can help!

BOY SCOUTS COURT OF HONOR BY LAURIE RUCKS, CLERK OF SESSION

I recently had the privilege of attending Troop 235's Court of Honor, held in August 2025. Boy Scout Troop 235 is a member of the Cape Fear Council. During the Court of Honor, the scouts are awarded the badges and honors they have worked for throughout the year. Badges such as kayaking, small boating, citizenship, animal study, climbing, backpacking, and skating were awarded, to name a few. There are more than 135 badges that the scouts can earn.

Some were awarded their new ranks, such as First Class, Second Class, Life Scout, and the prestigious Eagle Scout. To earn the Eagle Scout rank, there are 21 required merit badges that the Scout must earn. The Eagle Scout rank/award takes perseverance, ambition, responsibility, leadership, and hard work. As many of you know, over the years, we have had Eagle Scout projects conducted here at the church. The playground, the flagpole, and the patio were all Eagle Scout projects performed by Scout members of this church. A project is a requirement to attain the Eagle Scout rank.

The awards are not limited to the youth. Adult leaders also earn awards and badges, which are also awarded at the Court of Honor.

The meeting starts with the arrival of the Scout flags and the American flag. The Pledge of Allegiance is recited, as well as the Boy Scout Oath and Scout Law to open the ceremony. The meeting is opened and closed with a prayer by the scout chaplain. The Court of Honor is attended by parents, siblings, grandparents, and other family members and friends. The rankings, awards, and merit badges are handed out to youth as well as adult leaders. The assembly is entirely orchestrated by the scouts. Many stories are told to the enjoyment of everyone in attendance. The youth support each other and congratulate one another on their individual achievements. Family members are extremely involved in the lives of Scouts. They are recognized by standing with their youth during the awarding of their badge/award.

I learned about the Philmont experience, which is in New Mexico and is a 250,000-acre ranch provided by the Phillips 66 petroleum founder. All aspects of conservation are taught; a grueling hike up Mt. Phillips, repelling, camping, hiking. The Philmont trek is 12 days long, and the Scouts and Leaders carry all their supplies in their backpacks. You need to be in good physical shape to take on all these adventures, including the adult leaders! Remember, these leaders are taking off work to participate in this adventure with these youth; it is quite the commitment. Planning for this adventure starts about two years in advance of attending. Philmont Troop 235 will be returning to Philmont in 2027.

As the months advance, this Troop will be assembling in our parking lot to go camping, to hike in a park, and to work in community service. You can help by signing up on November 22 to give blood as they sponsor the Blood Connection Mobile donation center at our church. There will be other opportunities to support Troop 235 in the future. So, stay tuned.

I, for one, am very excited and honored to have our church host Troop 235. The Session looks forward to working with this fine group of individuals and youth as we grow together.
