

# Volunteers and Part-time BSM Directors

Do you feel uncertain about what you should be doing on campus? Here is a brief list to provide clarity for you. Feel free to contact your Regional Coordinator or to ask questions from others who are in similar ministry settings!!!

- **Engage the Campus by meeting students constantly and Staying FOCUSED on Relational Evangelism**

YOU have to prioritize creating opportunities to meet students who are not already engaged in the Christian life on campus/in a local church. Share the gospel with every student you meet. Use a Connection Card to follow up with any student who attends one of your events or who you meet on campus.

Ask for permission to have weekly tables out on campus where you can meet more students.

Find ways churches can access the campus and get them involved. Often asking a campus administrative official “What would you like to see happen on this campus?” or “What are some ways you could use some help serving the students on this campus?” will yield you opportunities. Recruit other adult volunteers and train them how to share the gospel with students on campus.

- **Make Disciples who Follow Christ (train them, build leaders)**

Meet regularly one on one (or in small groups) with potential student leaders and teach them how to follow Christ.

Help students assess and use their spiritual gifts on the campus.

Have conversations with them that give attention to prayer, personal growth and accountability. Offer students encouragement, challenge and support.

Have an excellent weekly event where you invite students into the group (lunch, bible study on campus, etc). Prepare well for these weekly events.

- **Send Students Out to Transform the World**

Challenge students to live out their faith on the campus (outreach events), in the community (ministry projects), and across the planet (mission trips) by providing them opportunities to participate in and experience missions.

Take students you know to meet other students when you are spending time with them on campus. Help them engage their friends and classmates. Teach your students how to share the gospel with every student they know and meet. This is how you make evangelism part of the dna of your group.

- **Tell the story of what God is doing on your Campus**

Use your social media networks to develop ministry partners by sharing your story with local churches, church leaders, prayer partners, and ministry supporters.

Complete the monthly update where you share stories of life transformation, prayer needs, and report your work.
