People: Father, we humble ourselves before you and confess that we are sinners, sinful



Pastor: "Comfort, comfort my people," says your God. "Speak tenderly to Jerusalem and proclaim to her, 'Your sins have been paid for.'" In his tender mercy, God has given his Son to die for you and for his sake forgives you all your sins. Therefore, upon this your confession, I announce the grace of God to you. In his stead and by his command, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the Holy Spirit.




