Confession and Promise of Forgiveness

Elder: Christians can sometimes think God chose them because of something inherent in them, some strength of virtue they possess. In fact, many Christians believe God chose them because they first chose Him. But Paul says in 1 Corinthians, chapter one: "Consider your calling, not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, so that no human being might boast before Him."

People: We naturally believe there is something we are or that we do that precipitated God's choice of us. Scripture tells us that God chooses us simply because He chooses us. We are sorry!

Elder: Paul continues in 1 Corinthians: Because of God you are in Christ Jesus who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and redemption, so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord." Because God chose us, we are redeemed, that is, purchased by the bloody death of Jesus from our slavery to ourselves, our being controlled by our human nature. And, we have received the gift of Christ's perfect righteousness because, though He lived the life we should have lived; yet, He died the death we should have died. Therefore, we are completely forgiven, totally accepted, and unconditionally loved because of what Jesus has done.

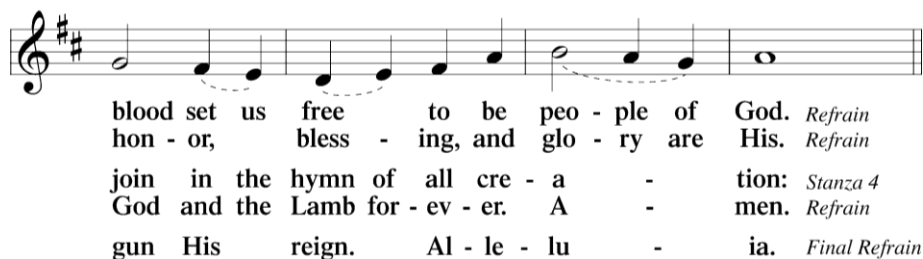
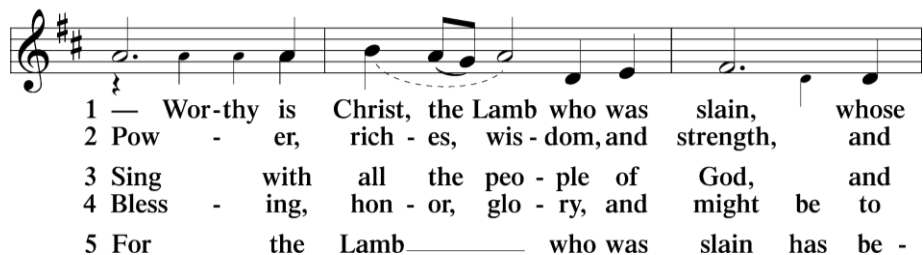

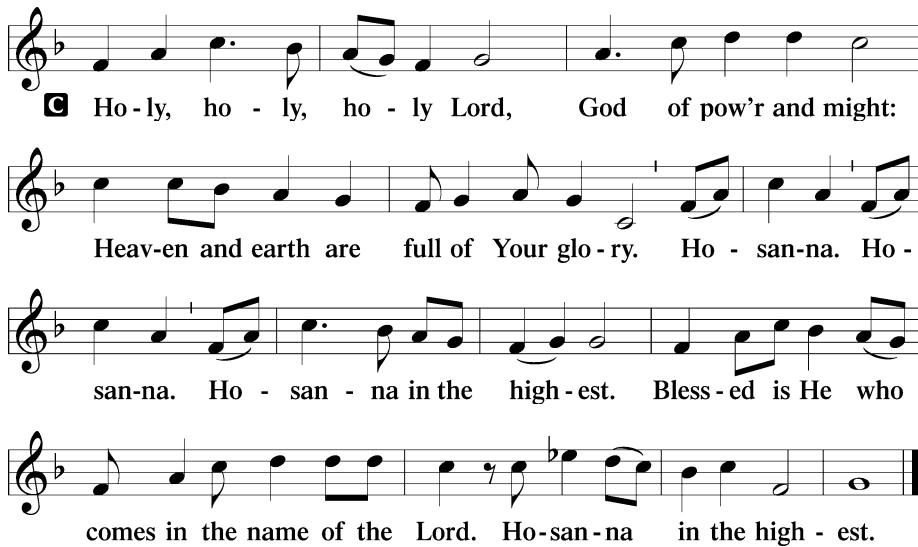

Distribution

As a member of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), Holy Communion is celebrated at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church in the glad confidence that our Lord, as His Word says, gives not only bread and wine, but also His true Body and Blood for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of our faith. Our Lord invites to His table those who believe He is truly present in this meal, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive as He forgives us.

Because the Bible teaches that this Sacrament may also be abused, and that participation in the Lord's Supper is an act of confession of faith, the LCMS ordinarily communes only those who have been instructed in the teachings of our church and who have confessed their faith in these teachings.

All are invited to the Lord's table. Those who share our confession of faith and who wish to commune are asked to extend their hands outward to receive the Sacrament. Others who have come forward will receive a blessing from the pastor. If you have any questions about this Communion statement, you are encouraged to speak with Pastor Koschmann. Thank you for respecting and honoring our Communion practice.
