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
As We Gather

Call to Worship

Isaiah 60:1; 9:2; 2 Corinthians 4:6

P: Arise, shine, for your light has come,

C: and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you.

P: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;

C: those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined.

P: For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness,"

C: has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

Confession and Absolution 2 Peter 3:9; Acts 17:30; Galatians 4:3–4; John 1:11–12; 3:17, 18

- P: The Lord is not slow to fulfill His promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance.
- C: The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now He commands all people everywhere to repent.
- P: In the same way we also, when we were children, were enslaved to the elementary principles of the world.
- C: But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law.

- P: He came to His own, and His own people did not receive Him.
- C: But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God.
- P: For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world,
- C: but in order that the world might be saved through Him.
- P: Beloved in Christ, let us confess our sin unto God our Father, that, placing our trust in His name, our hearts may be well-prepared to greet our newborn King.

[Silence for reflection of God's Word and for self-examination]

P: Most merciful God,

C: we confess that there is no one good, not even one, among us. All mankind has turned aside. We have willfully offended You, our Lord and Maker, in our thoughts, words, and actions. We have done what is evil and failed to do what is good, and thus deserve Your punishment both now and in eternity. But we are truly sorry for our sins and come to You for mercy. Gathered around the manger, we behold the Son You sent to save us all, and we turn to You for forgiveness. Grant us the gift Your Son came to bring: the forgiveness of our sins, that we may be renewed in faith and walk in the way that leads to everlasting life.

P: With a heart full of mercy and compassion, God saves us and forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained servant of the Word, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

C: And also with you.


P: Let us pray.

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Old Testament Reading

Isaiah 52:7-10

⁷How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." ⁸The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the LORD to Zion. ⁹Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the LORD has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem. ¹⁰The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Epistle Reading

Titus 3:4-7

⁴When the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, ⁵he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, ⁶whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

Gospel Lesson

Luke 2:1-20

¹In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶And while they were there, the time came

for her to give birth. ⁷And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

⁸And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear. ¹⁰And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹²And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"


¹⁵When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. ¹⁷And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. ¹⁸And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Distribution

As a member of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), Holy Communion is celebrated at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church in the glad confidence that our Lord, as His Word says, gives not only bread and wine, but also His true Body and Blood for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of our faith. Our Lord invites to His table those who believe He is truly present in this meal, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive as He forgives us.

Because the Bible teaches that this Sacrament may also be abused, and that participation in the Lord's Supper is an act of confession of faith, the LCMS ordinarily communes only those who have been instructed in the teachings of our church and who have confessed their faith in these teachings.

All are invited to the Lord's table. Those who share our confession of faith and who wish to commune are asked to extend their hands outward to receive the Sacrament. Others who have come forward will receive a blessing from the pastor. If you have any questions about this Communion statement, you are encouraged to speak with Pastor Koschmann. Thank you for respecting and honoring our Communion practice.


