## 7 Questions for Reflection on the Passage

1. What is this passage about? (Explain the passage in your own words)
2. What does it teach us about God?
3. What does it teach us about people (self, church, humanity in general)?
4. What does it teach us about us negatively (concerning sin, pride, anger, lust, etc.)?
5. What does it teach us positively (concerning grace, truth, love, faith, etc.)?
6. What does this passage command, encourage, or warn us (either explicitly or implicitly)?
7. How does this passage point us to the Person and Work of Christ (the Gospel)?

## 1 Question for Response to the Passage

1. How can I respond to what I've learned from this passage in my own life?

Examples:

Are there specific situations in my life that this passage addresses?

Are there sins in my life I need to repent of that I see?

Are there relationships in my life I need to address after reading this?

Who will I share what I learned today  
with?

How has this passage encouraged my walk with the Lord?
