Honest Grace

The late Rachel Held Evans once wrote,

"Convinced the gospel is a product we've got to sell to an increasingly shrinking market, we like our people to function as walking advertisements: happy, put-together, finished—proof that this Jesus stuff WORKS! ... But if the world is watching, we might as well tell the truth. And the truth is, the church doesn't offer a cure. It doesn't offer a quick fix. The church offers death and resurrection. The church offers the messy, inconvenient, gut-wrenching, never-ending work of healing and reconciliation. The church offers grace. Anything else we try to peddle is snake oil. It's not the real thing."

She's right. Too often, we come to church dressed in our Sunday best, plaster on our biggest smiles, and shove down whatever mess we're carrying inside. When someone asks how we're doing, the script is already written: "Oh, I'm doing good."

This way of thinking doesn't form a community shaped by the suffering, joy, and transformation of the gospel. Instead, it creates people who go through the motions—wearing masks, repeating lines, and hiding what's really going on. At its worst, it even breeds an environment where corruption and abuse are covered up in order to safeguard appearances.

But the gospel doesn't require us to be "fine." The good news is not about polishing our image or holding it all together. It is about grace in the middle of our mess. It is about a God who meets us in our brokenness, not after we've hidden it away. At its best, the church has always been a place where burdens are shared, wounds are named, and grace is encountered.

The greatest challenge facing the church today is not whether we can keep up with modern trends or win the latest culture war. The real challenge is that we too often cling to an image of perfection instead of becoming a thin place where the divine meets our scars and embraces our humanity.

The number one reason people are leaving the church is not disbelief but disillusionment. They are weary of hypocrisy. What they long for is authenticity, hope, and a community where they are both accepted as they are and transformed by grace. Yet too many churches have become more concerned with appearing holy than with being honest.

But there is another way. We can be a community that doesn't fear weakness but welcomes it—a church where people don't have to hide their doubts, struggles, or scars. We can choose honesty over



image, grace over appearances, and love over pretense. When we do, we become the kind of place where resurrection is not just a story we tell but a reality we live—where God's presence is felt in the midst of our honesty, and where people discover that the gospel truly is good news for real life.
