#### When Love Calls You

What does it mean to love our neighbors as ourselves? We hear this all the time but rarely do we reflect on it for our own lives, our faith, and how we practice that faith both individually and communally.

C.S. Lewis once said, "Love is not an affectionate feeling, but a steady wish for the loved person's ultimate good as far as it can be obtained." While you can certainly have affectionate feelings for your neighbor, to truly love them means desiring their flourishing as far as it can be obtained—and then doing what you can to help make that flourishing possible.

We all fall short of this every day. Surely there is someone in our lives, in our community, or even in our church family toward whom we could take an extra step of care, compassion, or understanding. My goal here isn't to judge, but to invite reflection. Being a Christian means more than attending church on Sunday, bringing food to a potluck, or joining a few committees. It means embodying love in tangible ways—seeing Christ in others and acting accordingly.

In Matthew 25:40, Jesus reminds us, "What you do for the least of these you do for me." Every act of kindness, every moment of listening, every effort to serve is an act of worship. The goal of faith is to shape us into people who serve and care for others, because in caring and loving others we honor the image of God in them.

Sin is both the omission of love and the rejection of its call—when we harm others instead of seeking their flourishing. We live in systems of sin, upheld by cultures that refuse to honor people as people, made in God's image, and instead value them only for their productivity or status. If we are to truly love our neighbors, we must be mindful of the needs and struggles people face—both individually and collective-ly—and then seek to respond with compassion and courage. We will not do this perfectly, and many of us are carrying our own burdens. But healing begins when we acknowledge our brokenness and open ourselves to the transforming love of Christ.

As we move toward Thanksgiving and into the season of Advent, may we see each act of kindness, generosity, or hospitality as a way of honoring Jesus himself. Every time we slow down to listen, share a meal, offer forgiveness, or meet a need, we are participating in the work of Christ in the world. In doing so, we not only prepare our hearts for his coming—we make his presence known among us, here and now.

So, I invite you into a season of responding to love's call, remembering that you, too, are God's beloved. You who are reading this may have a roof over your head, food in your belly, and a family who



holds you close and cherishes you. But your neighbor might not be as fortunate. Their hunger, their thirst, their loneliness are a cry for us to recognize their belovedness—and to act toward them as we would hope someone might act toward us if our cry were the same.
