Perfect Love Casts Out Fear: Living as Peacemakers in Today's World

Everywhere we turn, we feel it: violence, division, rumors of war. Fear is in the air. It seeps into our conversations, our newsfeeds, even our prayers. And fear—more than anything else—is the enemy's greatest weapon. Fear convinces us to divide the world into "us" and "them." Fear makes us forget that those on the other side are human too.

But here's the truth: being afraid isn't a sin—it's human. God made us with the capacity for fear because it helps us survive. Yet fear left unchecked easily warps into harm. Our culture trains us to weaponize fear: to turn pain into vengeance, hurt into hatred, and neighbors into enemies. As followers of Christ, we are called to a different way—not a spirit of fear, but a spirit of love, peace, compassion, and justice.

And in Jesus, we see what it looks like to face fear without letting fear rule us. In the Garden of Gethsemane, he was afraid. Scripture tells us he begged the Father to let the cup of suffering pass from him. His anguish was so great that he sweated blood. Yet, instead of meeting political violence with a sword, Jesus met it with sacrifice.

At the cross, we hear God's answer to fear and violence in these simple but powerful words: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do." If we are to imitate Christ in our culture, then we must steel our conscience to promote love instead of hate, to show compassion instead of fueling division, to speak truth in a sea of lies.

The call to be a peacemaker will not always feel peaceful. The world will resist it, because the message of the cross is this: we are all broken sinners in need of a Savior. The cross doesn't divide humanity into "us" vs. "them." It invites us all into a life of self-sacrificial love.

Fear will always try to have the last word, but the cross shows us it never does. In Christ, forgiveness triumphs over revenge, mercy over hate, and love over fear. So when you feel the pull to divide the world into "us" and "them," remember the way of Jesus. Remember the Garden. Remember the cross. And remember that God's Spirit is with you, empowering you to live as a peacemaker in a fearful and divided world.



And don't forget: the same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead is alive and active in you. So love boldly—even when it costs you. Because love is the only weapon strong enough to disarm fear.

Why do Presbyterians conduct a Kirkin' of the Tartans?

In 1559, John Knox brought Reformation theology to Scotland from Switzerland where John Calvin was leading the Reformation after Martin Luther nailed the 95 Theses' to the door of the Catholic church in 1517. The Church of Scotland was established using a new representative system of government utilizing presbyters or elders. This became the Presbyterian Church in Scotland and later in America. In Scotland, the church is referred to as the "kirk." The Kirkin' o' the Tartans is the blessing of the families by the church and is a Scottish-American tradition often accompanied by a bagpipe.
