A Life Shaped By Love

When we think of salvation, many of us picture it mainly as "going to Heaven when we die." But salvation is so much bigger than that. It's about healing and flourishing—the wholeness of our lives being restored in God's love. It's about bruises becoming balms, wounds turning into blessings, and even death losing its sting.

One of the early church leaders, Athanasius of Alexandria, put it like this: "Christ was made man so that we might be made God." He didn't mean we literally became divine. What he meant was that Christ came so we could be joined to God's own life—a life overflowing with hope, healing, and love. The early church called this vision *Theosis*—a way of saying that salvation is about sharing in the abundant life Christ transforms us for and invites us into, a life we can only grasp because he has overcome sin and death.

This means salvation isn't just a future promise but a present reality. It's God's Spirit reshaping us day by day so that we reflect more of Christ's love, mercy, and compassion. Salvation touches every part of who we are—our minds learning new ways of thinking, our hearts being softened to love more deeply, even our bodies being restored as instruments of God's goodness in the world.

Think, for example, of someone carrying the deep wound of betrayal. Left alone, that pain could harden into bitterness, mistrust, and isolation. But when that person opens their wound to Christ's healing, something remarkable begins to happen.

The hurt doesn't vanish overnight, but slowly the Spirit works: forgiveness takes root, compassion grows, and what was once only a source of pain becomes a spring of empathy for others who are hurting. That is salvation—not just a ticket to Heaven, but God drawing us into the divine dance where we learn sacred rhythms of love, grace, wholeness, and justice.

When Jesus said, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10), he wasn't talking about material wealth or easy living. He was talking about a life so rooted in God's love that even suffering and struggle can be transformed. It's the kind of life where forgiveness replaces bitterness, where courage grows in the face of fear, and where hope rises even in the shadow of death.

This is the gift Christ offers us: not just life after death, but life before death—a life being healed, renewed, and made whole in God's love. Salvation is God drawing us into his own life so that, little by little, our scars become signs of grace and our wounds become blessings. And as that happens in us, we

are sent into the world as living witnesses of this abundant life, carrying Christ's hope and healing to those around us. This is salvation—not just the hope of heaven, but the healing of our lives in Christ's love.
