CrossTrainers Canada Statement of Faith

There is one God, eternally co-existent in three distinguishable personalities; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. (1 John 5:7)

All who receive Christ are born again of the Holy Spirit at the moment of salvation, are baptized by Him into the Church, the body of Christ, and possess all spiritual blessings in Christ (Eph 1:3-14)

The victorious reign and future, personal return of Jesus Christ who will judge all people with justice and mercy. (Rev 19:11-21, Rev 20:11-15)

Purity in life should characterize each Christian, with Christ-like traits nurtured by obedience to the Scriptures and under the Holy Spirit's guidance. (Phil 4:8-9, Gal 5:22-23)
