


A note from the pastor...

A new year is here, and they always come so quickly. Many of us pause to try and consider what we might do differently in the coming year or how we might focus our attention on something important to us. In the church, this is a Lectionary Year A. In worship most of the Gospel readings will be from the Gospel of Matthew. Considering the impulse to try something different and find something worthy of our focus in this new year, we will spend the year focused on the Gospel of Matthew. We probably won't go verse for verse like some traditions but will stick with the lectionary. I think this extended focus will allow us time to dig deeply into what Matthew is saying about Jesus and to us.

One commentary that has been helpful to me in thinking about the message of Matthew is *Matthew and the Margins* by Warren Carter. Carter shows how the Gospel of Matthew focuses on the people and places at the margins of society. Carter is a scholar who takes the historical context of the gospel seriously and draws important lessons for today from the message of the text.

In January, we will focus on the first four chapters of the text looking at the visit of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus, John the Baptist and the beginning of Jesus' ministry. I hope to offer some Talk-It-Over times after service where we can dive deeper into the text. Author, Alexander Shaia shows how Matthew is a book about facing times of change. This is always an important theme but seems even more pressing today. I pray that this time of meditation on Matthew will be a blessing for all of us.

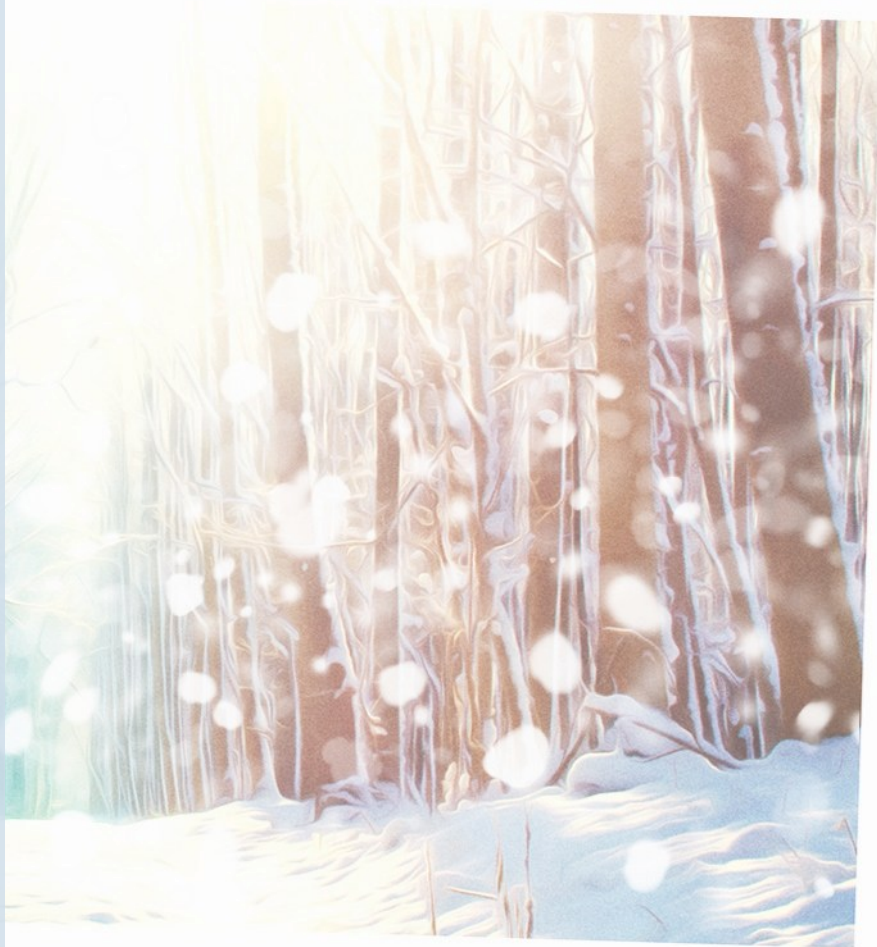

“A Candlelight Concert” Music & More’s first concert collaboration with the Choral Arts Society of Southeastern WI was a spectacular sold-out success! The pews were full and more chairs were set up in the rear of the sanctuary to accommodate the large crowd. There were a number of new attendees. The darkened sanctuary was filled with beautiful candlelight, red poinsettias, soul-stirring music, and graceful dancers. We received positive feedback afterwards that this type of peaceful, reflective, and hope-filled concert is needed during the busy holiday season.

A soprano soloist, positioned in the balcony, opened the concert with a traditional Mennonite song. The first set featured four selections from guitarist Mark Paffrath, soprano Liz Steffensen, violinist Darlene Rivest, and cellist Michelle Venturella. CAS pianist Randy Fischer played a lovely version of “Away in the Manger,” with cello and violin accompaniment.


Fifty-four members of the Choral Arts Society participated, conducted by Jim Schatzman. Pat Badger conducted the Women’s Choir. Beloved Christmas repertoire included “Ave Maria,” “Wexford Carol,” “I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day,” “A Thousand Candles,” “O Magnum Mysterium,” and a memorable version of “Silent Night” originally made popular by the group Mannheim Steamroller. Several poetry readings were interspersed throughout the program. A dozen dancers from The Studio of Classical Dance Arts performed two pieces: A traditional Israeli candle dance and “Waltz of the Snowflakes” from The Nutcracker. An audience candle-lighting, alongside a Yo-Yo Ma arrangement of “Dona Nobis Pacem/Auld Lang Syne,” added to the beauty of the evening. Donations received in the offering baskets were earmarked for the Women’s Resource Center.

A festive post-concert reception was held in Ihrman Hall where attendees were entertained by the spirited Prairie School Jazz Combo. An assortment of delicious treats was provided by O&H Danish Bakery and some CAS members.

Pat Badger organized the annual cookie box sale and more than \$1,400 was raised for M&M’s three youth music scholarship funds! Bakers from OBUUC joined once again with First Pres bakers to turn out hundreds of beautiful Christmas cookies which sold out at \$10 a box.




BLESSING THE THRESHOLD
