This is a family favorite that my mom made often (as evidenced by the number of stains!). I have adapted the recipe over time: I pure the broth and vegetables instead of rubbing the vegetables through a sieve, and I use a lot more curry powder and have never added a blade of mace...I don't even know where I would find one. Enjoy!

MULLIGATAWNY SOUP

5 coups white stock (5 chix. boullion cubest carrot cubes carrot cubes celerycubes t cup each l apple sliced
2 chicken breasts cut in dice tcup butter
1/3 cup flour teas. curry powder
1 blade mace
2 cloves
sprig of parsley
salt and pepper (over)
```

Cook vegetables, apples and chicken in butter until brown. Add flour, curry powder mace cleves paraley and stock, simmer for 1 hr.

Strain, reserve chicken, and rub vegetables through sieve. Add chicken to strained and soup, season with salt and pepper, and serve with boiled rice.

About the logo...

As we discussed our Advent theme and how hope and fear are interwoven in our lives, a vision emerged: hands gently cupped around candles at a vigil. When we gather at a vigil, fear is often present, weighing on us like a heavy fog. The candle in our hands can feel fragile, insignificant, the flame

easily extinguished. But when we turn to our neighbors to spread the light, it multiplies, wrapping the whole community in warmth. The darkness is not eradicated; if anything, it further illuminates the flicker of the candles. In these vigil spaces, grief and fear dance with gratitude and hope. In these spaces, we find courage and unity. We are reminded that God is near. This vision captures our prayer for this Advent series: that it will illuminate both our hopes and our fears and remind us that God is near.

As we developed the branding, we thought that the image of a lantern could similarly hold these ideas together. Lanterns are often used to light the way as we gently step forward into unseen or unknown territory. The lantern, like hope, steadies our hands and eyes as we walk forward through the night. In the logo, a lantern contains the swirl of a flame—it's active and powerful, like the Holy Spirit, and like the hope that burns inside us. The candlelight cannot be contained, and so, like hope, it grows, emanating into our guiding question for the season, "What do you fear?" The branding photography captures the beauty of both dark and light by focusing on the patterned shadows cast from a lantern. From this ethereal space where our greatest fears greet our most palpable hopes, possibility emerges.

Luckily for Central Church in Matanzas the Seminary is just up the hill from the church, a short walk. In Summer of 2024, Pastor Ary assumed the role of Principal and Professor at the Seminary. All of the Cuba travelers from our church have stayed at the Seminary and walked down to Central Church to participate in activities.

Dear siblings in Christ:

Through this letter, we greet you in the name of the Lord and inform you that as of yesterday, Sunday, October 12th, we are no longer the pastors of Central Church of Matanzas. After twelve and a half years of diligent ministry, during which gradual growth was experienced numerically, spiritually, and in community service in this beloved church, we have decided no to renew the pastoral contract.

After taking on important responsibilities at the Evangelical Theological Seminary (SET) since June 2024, Ary as Principal and Professor, and Beidy as Executive Assistant and professor, it has become increasingly evident to us that it is not possible to carry out work in both institutions with full dedication, as we wish to do. This decision has not been easy to make, but its purpose is to allow us to focus on the institutional development of the Seminary. SET is an essential part of the Presbyterian-Reformed Church in Cuba, and we consider this new opportunity to serve the church as part of our pastoral vocation, which we have always develop as a pastoral team.

You have been an important part of this journey that we, as pastors, have had, and we also want to thank you for all your support and especially for the love for this beloved church. It is our hope that the relationships we have built up to this point can continue to be strengthened in the future. We also hope that, with the new pastor that the church calls, relationships of respect and love between your churches can continue to be built.

We are copying this letter to Pastor Anays Noda Linares, who is the assigned pastor by Matanzas Presbytery until the church is able to make a new pastoral call. Please, we ask for your prayers for this new moment of our lives and ministries.
