A note from the pastor...

This December we will be contemplating the Advent theme of insisting on hope even as we ask the question: "What do you fear?" We know that these are days of increased anxiety in our world, but that is not much different than the age Jesus was born into. The creative team behind the theme have this to say:

"Luke's Gospel begins the story of Jesus with this opening line: "In the time of Herod..." This detail may seem minor to modern readers; however, it reveals layers of information about the fearful world Jesus entered, one filled with rampant oppression, economic disparity, uncertainty, and instability. A world not so unlike our own. And yet, throughout the stories of Christ's birth, the whispers of angels deliver a surprising message: "Do not fear." In our own time, we might ask: is it even possible to be fearless in a fearful world? When Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the magi are each called into God's redemptive story, they do not deny their fears—they move through them. They ask questions, hold fast to courage, trust in good news, and say, "Here I am, Lord." When we find ourselves in fearful times, can we acknowledge our fears while also insisting on hope?

Every Advent, we light candles, sing carols, and pray for Christ's coming because we believe God entered a frightened world to bring good news. We hold onto hope because we believe that Christ did come—that's the promise of the season. Our hope is not flimsy or fleeting. It's gritty, resilient, and can endure—no matter what we fear or face. This season, let us insist on hope and trust that good news is greater than fear."

Christmas Food Baskets (donations needed urgently)

The Deacons need our help with Christmas Food Basket cash/check donations. Rather than giving families an actual food basket, the selected recipient families will receive a grocery gift card so they can purchase the food items that their family needs. All monetary donations that are given to Julian Thomas School will support this initiative.

Christmas Toy Drive

We are collecting toys, crafts and gift items for Julian Thomas School now through December 8th. There is a designated box in Ihrman Hall for the donations but if you do not see it (it gets moved around when there are events) you can hand off to Meg Daniels or ask Pastor Darren to put your donations in his office.

Every year the teachers and staff identify students whose families are in financial distress and could benefit from having a brighter Holiday. They then put together Santa Bags for all of the children in the selected family.

Our target gift price range is \$10-\$30 per item:

- Hot Wheels or other cars/trucks
- Action figures
- Barbies (of all color)
- Craft kits for boys/girls that include all needed supplies

This ministry remains strong because of the partnership between our church family and the Racine community. Thank you for the many ways you show up—with food, financial gifts, prayers, and compassion. And as always, you are warmly invited to stop by any Wednesday from 4:00-7:00[™] to see the pantry in action. As one of the only evening food pantries in Racine, we welcome all visitors who want to understand, witness, or support this ministry firsthand.

A heartfelt thank you to all of our volunteers, whose faithful work ensures that every guest is cared for with dignity and kindness. From packing boxes to organizing shelves to greeting families, their dedication is the heartbeat of this ministry.

This fall, the Racine Journal Times published an article about the increasing demand at food pantries across our community—and our very own First Pres Food Pantry was highlighted. We are grateful for the awareness this brought to the needs of our neighbors and the important work happening within our walls.

- BREAKFAST ITEMS: Oatmeal, cereal, pancake mix, syrup

Shelley's Peanut Butter Cookies

Ingredients:

1 cup salted butter

1 cup granulated sugar

1 cup packed brown sugar

1 cup creamy peanut butter

2 eggs (room temperature)

1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

2½ cups all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking soda

½ teaspoon salt

Directions:

- Cream butter.
- Add both types of sugar and the peanut butter; mix well. Beat in eggs and vanilla.
- Add dry ingredients and mix until cookie dough forms.
- Chill for one hour.
- Preheat oven to 350°.
- Using a small cookie scoop, shape into balls and drop on parchment lined cookie sheets.
- Flatten with fork tines.
- Bake for 15 minutes, then remove from pan and cool.

Comments:

- If you prefer a sweeter cookie, the dough can be rolled in granulated sugar before going on the cookie sheets.
- Or, for a nuttier flavor, they can be rolled in finely chopped pecans, walnuts, etc.
- · Also, I always use salted butter when cooking or baking.
