FEAR DOESN'T STOP US

A Step Toward Home

I will not tell you to buck up,

We would have understood.

But instead, people came to the funeral.

They crowded the pews with black hats and mourning cries.
They sang “Amazing Grace” when the worst had happened.

In a world full of fear, we have choices to make—
bury ourselves and close the curtains,
or fill the church and choose to sing.

I’m not saying it’ll be easy,
but if you want to carry the tenderest part of yourself out into the world,
I’ll begin to sing.
