A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

BY GOD'S FREE-GRACE OR MAN'S FREE-WILL?

The Synod of Dort and the First Article of the Remonstrance

Last month, we introduced the Synod of Dort (1618–1619) and the controversy surrounding the teachings of Jacobus Arminius and his followers, the Remonstrants. This month we turn to the first article of their teaching and the biblical response given by the Synod.

Article One: Conditional Election

The Remonstrants taught that before the world began, God chose to save those He foresaw would respond to the gospel in faith. In other words, election was based on God's knowledge of our future choice.

While this view tried to emphasize real faith in Christ, it missed a crucial truth: after the fall, our wills are bound by sin. We make choices, but apart from Christ, those choices are always in rebellion against God. Scripture teaches that "every intention of the thoughts of <u>man's</u> heart was only evil continually" (Gen. 6:5), and that "no one seeks for God" (Rom. 3:11). Left to ourselves, we cannot choose Christ.

The Biblical Response: Unconditional Election

The Synod of Dort responded by affirming that salvation is entirely the result of God's free and sovereign grace. God would have been just to leave all people in sin, but in His love, He chose to save a people for Himself through Christ. As Paul writes:

"By grace you are saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God" (Eph. 2:8).

"He chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him" (Eph. 1:4).

This truth is not meant to stir up fear but to give us assurance. Our salvation does not depend on our weak will or wavering faith but on God's unchanging purpose.

Why This Matters Today

Many in the church shy away from the doctrine of election, fearing it may cause division or doubt. But the Synod encouraged believers to teach it faithfully, since it is found in Scripture and is given to comfort God's people.

When we struggle in faith, this doctrine reminds us that God's grace is stronger than our weakness. He will not "break a bruised reed or quench a smoldering wick" (Isa. 42:3). Instead, He uses His ordained means—the Word, the sacraments, and prayer—to strengthen us and keep us in Christ.

Election is not a cold doctrine, but a warm reminder that our salvation rests entirely in God's gracious hands. It leads us to humility, assurance, and joyful worship of the God who saves sinners by His grace alone.
