Feeling Drained Less?—Part 4

The Bible is packed with powerful, life-transforming promises. God has given us this vault of infinite riches to be an instruction book for life. Why, then, do we often feel drained and powerless?


Notice the pictorial of being drained (See Prayer Thoughts for January – March) has been deleted and a pictorial of a yoke as described by Jesus is offered to help the reader acknowledge the presence of Jesus in life.

Matthew 11:28-30

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

To **take the yoke of Christ** is to put ourselves in a relationship with **Christ** as his servants and subjects and to conduct ourselves accordingly. The **yoke of Christ** is not just a **yoke** from **Christ** but also a **yoke** with him.



Sustainable Energy

That's what I'm working so hard at day after day, year after year, doing my best with the energy God so generously gives me. Colossians 1:29, MSG

It takes a lot of energy to keep our world powered up, lit up, and filled up. Scientists tell us that humans daily consume about 63,300,000 megawatt-hours of electricity. Approximately half of our energy comes from oil and natural gas, and another quarter comes from coal and nuclear reactors. The remaining 25 percent comes from renewable energy sources.

Put all that together and multiply it by a billion, and it still wouldn't equal a split-second of the energy God makes available to His children for living a Christ-like life in this world. Think of the phrase Paul used—all the energy Christ so powerfully works in me.

Is that true for you?

Jesus sends strength into our souls by the Holy Spirit, and that's why we're constantly told to be filled with the Spirit (Ephesians 5:18), to walk in the Spirit (Galatians 5:16), to pray in the Spirit (Ephesians 6:18), to love in the Spirit (Colossians 1:8), and to be in the Spirit on the Lord's Day (Revelation 1:10).

A Prayer for Clarity – (Lord, will You help me to understand truth?)

I trust You with all that I am. Lord, will You help me to understand truth? Guide me. Remind me who I am. Give me rest in the knowledge that I am Your child. (Matthew 10:30; Psalm 56:8; Psalm 44:21)

A Prayer for Strength

Lord, You promise never to grow weary. You supply limitless power to the weak, and You increase the strength of those who need it. Thank You for renewing my strength each day as I trust in You. Lord, teach me to wait on You. Lift me up on the wings of eagles so that I can soar above my circumstances. My to-do list is long, and my trials are great. But You give me strength. You have no rival, no equal. You are the Creator of heaven and earth. Nothing is too much for You! (Isaiah 40:28-31) God will keep every promise He has ever made. His Word cannot be broken.
