HOW TO LISTEN TO GOD SITTING BEFORE THE LORD – PART 2

God's desire is for us to spend time and sit with Him. A profitable time with God is not a spontaneous occurrence, but require certain disciplines to aid in personal meditation.

REQUIREMENTS FOR MEDITATION

TIME

A season of time, length of time is determined by your purpose. Psalm 62:5 enjoins us to "wait silently for God alone with expectation on Him. If we tell God we don't have time for Him, we are really indicating:

We don't have time for life, for joy, for peace, for direction, or prosperity (God is the source of all of these).

Meditation – a period of time set aside to contemplate the Lord, God, listen to Him, and allow Him to permeate a person's spirits.

When a person meditates something happens to equip

us in completing individual duties and in the preparation for life.

Meditation can resolve a troubled heart, maybe by slowing the pace of living and provide a lifetime compass. Parents teach their children about meditation through example—

a great heritage: praying parents.

STILLNESS

Use Psalm 46:10 as a guide. Set aside time and learn to be still in God's Presence. In that still mode a person is able to concentrate and allow competing elements of live to ebb away. In those quiet moments in time each person is able to sense God's benevolent goodness, greatness, and grace, (at the forefront of their mind) just as problems begin to diminish.

SECLUSION

Notice in Mark 1:35 Jesus departed to a solitary place and prayed. Since Jesus demonstrated the importance of being secluded before God, we must also, follow in Jesus' steps. Even husband and wives should be alone in solitude with Almighty God—nothing will bring a couple closer to intimacy with each other. God wants our absolute, undivided attention (no competition of others) so that He can love each person

with His loving, divine arms. Each of us needs to be alone with God otherwise our minds will always be divided. Be aware that private meditation with Jesus will allow Jesus to have each of us to Himself—His private workings are often His most precious.

SILENCE

Consider the intent of Isaiah 30:15 - "in quietness and confidence is your strength"

Often times people describe meditation as a one-way conversation because they do all the talking—they never pause to hear God's responses. Being quiet before God allows Him to interject His thoughts into a person's mind or a vibrant scripture passage, or reveal an absorbing truth, or bring peace to the inner being, or all of these.

Sit before God in silence, let Him pour Himself into you, speaking clearly to your heart (also move in your spirit and impress your mind). God has saved us to glorify Him, love Him, and truly understand Him.

SELF-CONTROL


During meditation a person may not readily feel anything happening—not detecting God at work. Always strive to focus your attention on God—maybe start with a specific scripture passage. Then stop reading and think just about God. Consider Proverbs 8:34 (NLT) -

"Joyful are those who listen to me, watching for me daily at my gates, waiting for me outside my home!"

Important: daily, deliberate steps to engage a person's mind, body, and life toward spending time, waiting and listening for God to speak. Find a most effective, comfortable body position keeping in mind that God is interested in the position of your heart, not the body.
